

From the Vicarage

It's the time of year when leaves are turning russet brown and falling, conkers appear on paths and playgrounds and there is a medley of fireworks and early Christmas craft fairs! Amidst all of these activities and before we look ahead to Christmas, there is also the opportunity to engage with another ancient festival.

All Hallows' or All Saints' Day is celebrated in many places at the beginning of November and is a tradition with a rich history. Paul the apostle referred to all communities of Christians as 'saints' – people called to love God and their neighbour and to seek fullness of life by following Christ. Gradually, a feast day emerged on which the Church gave thanks for the lives and deaths of the 'saints' including those famous and obscure.

All Saints' Day is like a family reunion day for the church, when the old family photograph albums are pulled out and we remember where we came from. Stories are swapped of relatives in the faith, saints old and new, and we pray for God's continued guidance.

It's also a time when we can reflect on an unsung saint in our neighbourhood, whose faithful acts of kindness and generosity inspire us and perhaps portray a richer, deeper experience of life with all its sorrows and joys.

Most people can think of their own example of an unsung saint – perhaps someone who acted as a mentor in our childhood or inspired us later in life. By remembering and being grateful for such people, we also recall our own responsibility to support and inspire others in similar ways. In doing so, we may point towards a life of faith, hope and love, the fullness of life which All Saints' Day reminds us of.

For our October meeting we read 'Silk' by Alessandro Baricco. This was a short book written in an unusual style, the story of the lengths that one man went to in order to obtain valuable silk worm eggs when disease hit European sources, travelling to Japan from France at a time when the former was more or less closed to the Western World. The first reaction of one or two us was 'weird' but in the end the general feeling was that we all loved it. It was beautifully written and very

gentle, with the occasional event that 'sliced through it like a knife'. It gradually turns from a story simply about the production of silkworm eggs, and the need to obtain them at any cost, to a love story.

It was suggested that the repetition used to relate certain aspects reinforced them, in particular the journey Hervé Joncour had to make to and from Japan. No one saw the end coming, which revealed one of the main characters in a different light. It was also interesting in that it gave insights into certain historical events and sericulture (silk production). Some research on the web by one of our number revealed that the town in Japan which was Joncour's ultimate destination had indeed been a centre for silk production which is currently being resurrected, and that other events which formed the basis of the story, were historically correct. The part that Louis Pasteur played in the industry was interesting.

It was well translated by Ann Goldstein, who it was felt had been able to capture the style and spirit of the story, a difficult thing to achieve. Our final verdict was it was a charming book which we would recommend, with a score of 9 out of 10.

Our next book, to be reviewed on Wednesday 14th November at 8 pm, is 'The Running Hare: The Secret Life of Farmland' by John Lewis-Stempel, winner of the Thwaites Wainwright Prize 2015.

Our December meeting, on Wednesday 19th December, will be our pre-Christmas meal at 7.30 for 8 pm (partners welcome). Rather than reviewing a book you are invited to bring a favourite Christmas/winter poem or short reading. Weston Colville Marsh Tit Study

November is a good month to spot young Marsh Tits on your garden feeders, if you can see the individual trees in a deciduous or mixed wood from your house.

We now have over 30 colour-ringed Marsh Tits, from 'King Charles the First' through to 'Useless Eustace' and 'Godzilla' (poor little birds!), but there seem to be plenty of unringed birds about. We'd love to hear about your sightings . . .cambsmarti@gmail.com, m_stammers@btinternet.com or Chassenge.

Hopefully, we'll soon be starting a research project with the University of Cambridge on the effect of gut bacteria on cognition in wild Tits, to complement our ongoing RAS study. This will involve DNA sequencing of bird poo and matching it to the behaviour of the bird that produced it in simple, voluntary, visual puzzles placed outdoors (but more on that in upcoming issues of Chasse, mostly because I enjoy a good cliffhanger – don't you?).

In other news, we have discovered that Emma Kaye is in fact a secret Nuthatch Whisperer. Yes, really! I enclose photographic proof, taken in late September. This young male Nuthatch flew onto Emma's arm after she released it and wouldn't leave her for a good 20 seconds, allowing me to catch this very rare scene.

The October meeting was entertained and informed by Nigel Start, a show judge, who shared his tips for successful 'Growing for Show'. The main tips were to know when your show will be held, to make sure that the produce is at its peak at the right time. Also, watering is key to producing uniform vegetables. Water stress results in size and shape variation, which is undesirable on the show bench. Size does not matter as much as uniformity. Finally, presentation can be the difference between your entry and others. Where the judge has to choose between two or more excellent entries, the one that is best presented will get the first prize. In 2019 the Balsham Gardening Club show will be in September so hopefully we will get lots of entries.

The next meeting will be at 19.15 on 6th November when Claire Matthews will give a talk on 'The History of Easton Lodge – the Countess and her Gardens'. The venue is the Meadow School Hall, and the talk will start at 19.30 prompt and be followed by the AGM. As always, new members are welcome.

Harold's Tips:

- Sow broad beans in well drained ground
- Plant bulbs for the spring display ensuring that they are planted deep enough
- Plant autumn planting onion sets and shallots
- Clean the greenhouse and make sure it is storm proof and the heater, if used, is working properly
- Collect leaves for making leaf mould
- Clean out water butts in readiness for autumn rain
- Dig in compost or manure where hungry crops are to be grown next season
- Hope for better growing weather next year!


