Coronavirus (Covid-19) update

At a national level the Public Health England website www.gov.uk/government/organisations/public-health-england and the NHS UK website www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/ provide up to date information and health advice.

The current evidence is that for the vast majority of the population the Covid-19 virus causes a mild illness which can be safely managed at home with rest, paracetamol and fluids just like a normal 'flu-like illness. However, for those with significant other medical problems and for the elderly it can be more serious.

With this in mind we have postponed all face to face GP appointments and some routine nurse appointments, and are now offering an enhanced telephone service and also a non-urgent dedicated email address, *capccg.covid19.gmp@nhs.net*, 8 am to 6 pm Monday to Friday.

Practical advice: first and foremost is the need to wash your hands on a regular basis – warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds. This alone will help slow down the spread of the virus and help protect you, your family and our community.

From the Rectory

We live in tumultuous times. The country is experiencing its greatest crisis since the end of the second world war and concern, worry and fear are seeping into our lives. There is, however, also a genuine upsurge of solidarity and compassion, with people stepping forward to support their local communities and those who feel vulnerable. It's often at times of greatest trial we see the best in each other and remember what's really important in life.

As we reflect on the hope of Easter during this time of crisis, we celebrate how the new life offered by Jesus overcomes despair and death. As we are reminded of our own broken humanity in the fear and betrayal which led to Jesus' crucifixion, we also remember that the risen Jesus told his followers not to be afraid, but to receive the gift of his Spirit. We encounter this good news afresh through scripture, prayer and the work of that same Spirit, and thereby see faith, hope and love become tangible.

You may also know that many initiatives have started throughout our local villages, where people are offering telephone support to those who are self-isolating and showing practical love for our neighbours by helping with the delivery of food, medicines or other essentials. Please consider how you may best support such initiatives as we seek to help and love one another in the time ahead.






Weston Colville Marsh Tit Study

Your Marsh Tits will have paired up and begun nesting. At Joyce's legendary bird bistro in Weston Colville, 4+ year old male Yellow Right, Black Left 'Dexter' has returned after a considerable absence, and his visits coincide with Red over Blue over White 'Tatiana', a female hatched last year. Tatiana has been visiting the sunflower hearts regularly, so we're hopeful she's producing eggs and feeding chicks. Sadly, another Barn Owl has been found dead from a vehicle collision, this time along Six Mile Bottom. That makes two Barn Owls which we know about killed in eight months on our roads,.

A postmortem by the Predatory Bird Monitoring Scheme on 'Barney', who died on the B1052 between West Wratting and Balsham, gave cause of death as 'road accident' with these notes: "Multiple fractures including sternum, wings and legs, haemorrhage throughout body cavity. Heart detached and crushed, damage to all internal organs and tissues."



These birds are not fast flyers; I've timed them hunting at 24 mph. The latest bird was carrying prey, so would have been even slower. It should be easy to miss them, if you're not driving too fast?

Those of you who spend time with Robins and Blue Tits will know that they're not always friendly birds. I present Exhibit A from Twitter (appropriately).



So, imagine our surprise when this picture (below) turned up on our camera feeder. It's clear that the camera has been rumbled! The IR detector window is



pitted with many pecks, and this could be 'smoking gun' evidence of the culprits. We think the detector is emitting some light or noise which we can't see or hear, which fascinates these very disparate species enough to forget about bullying each other.

Well, that's it for this glorious month. Spring has sprung!

At the parish council meeting on Monday 9th March the items below are some of the matters discussed. The full draft minutes are available on the notice boards in the village.

Litter Picking: Colin McCall and his team, who do a tremendous job keeping the footpaths tidy and clear of litter and who have just given the bus shelter a spring clean and have also washed the various sign posts in the village, will be organising a springtime litter pick-up some time in April and would be most grateful for some extra hands to volunteer to help. The date will be advertised shortly. Colin McCall and his team were thanked for all they did.

Council News: there is a vacancy on the parish council due to the resignation of Barry Glennon-Lynch. Please contact any councillor or the parish clerk if you might be interested in filling the vacancy.

A decision had not been made on S/2931, a resubmission to which the council objected the last time, and the application was withdrawn. (Since the meeting a decision to object to S/2931 was agreed). Pre/0327/19 – a Certificate of Permitted Permission is being requested from Planning as the new play area is almost ready for use.



Finance: a complete list of authorised payments and monies received is in the draft minutes, copies of which are on the noticeboards.

Maintenance:

- 1. Three free trees given to the parish by SCDC have now been selected and will be planted in The Causeway. A resident in The Causeway would like to plant a wildflower area in front of his house and permission is being sought from Highways.
- 2. The dilapidated pub will again be inspected for its safety by SCDC Planning.
- 3. Telephone box: this will remain as a landmark in the village. It is in need of some care and attention. If someone would like to volunteer to give it a spring clean, the council will be happy to pay for any cleaning materials used or paint purchased.
- 4. The parish council are concerned about hedging in the parish and would ask that hedges which have become overgrown and are a hazard to the pedestrian or driver are cut back as soon as possible. The parish council has the authority to contract someone to do the cutting back where necessary if the job is not done by the owner, who will be charged the cost of doing this.

Recreation Ground & Pavilion:

- 1. A key is needed to facilitate use of the defibrillator equipment, which will be placed in a safe key box.
- 2. A request has been made by WWFC to put eight concrete hard stands at the far side of the ground so dug-outs can be attached during the football season. The council asked for fuller details.

Traffic Issues & Speed Restriction Equipment:

- a) Footpath along Six Mile Bottom Road: following an inspection by Joshua Rutherford, Henry Batchelor and three councillors, a report had been written by Cllr Davey saying that the cost could be £75,000. He will be putting in an application to the LHI scheme.
- b)Road improvement measures: Cllr Davey reported that there is not much one can do but suggested a 'not suitable for HGVs' on the Six Mile Bottom Road. Following an incident in Mill Road there is now a speed watch held there.
- c) Wadlow Windfarm funding: Cllr Davey will be applying for funding for a further SID and would like individuals to write letters supporting this application.

Play area: this is now almost ready for use, with just one more piece of equipment to be placed. The chairman thanked Cllr Chandler and Ben Wilcocks for the enormous amount of work they had done in getting this project so swiftly put into place. The equipment insurance will be increased to £63,000.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held at 7.30 pm on Monday 11th May, followed by the parish council meeting at 8.15 pm. All are most welcome to attend.

Weston Colville Parish Council

At the parish council meeting held on Monday 2nd March, the items discussed included the following.

- 1. Public Participation Session: a presentation was made by the architect about the proposed Ivy House development. The proposal (although no planning application yet) was that a three-bedroom house would be built at the front to replace Ivy House, and then four further modest two/three-bedroom properties would be built behind it replacing the existing outbuildings. Off street parking would be provided. Concern was raised by some parishioners about the boundary treatment, as currently many of the properties have a building against them; it was advised that it was likely that walls would be built instead of fencing panels, to retain the feel of what is there currently. Bat surveys have been done and the bats will have habitation boxes. The planning application will be submitted soon.
- 2. **Flooding:** this section was brought forward to discuss with the county councillor. Photos were shared of severe flooding that occurred at the Common Road end of the village on 29th February. There was debris in the Whiting's Grove culvert, and the concrete sill had come loose on the other side of

the road, so the pipes were not supported. The photos have been emailed to the Flood Officer.

As yet there is no response as to who owns the land at the bottom of Horseshoe Lane. The drainage work was completed at Church End on 14th February, however the road drain has been moved 6", and a slight tarmac lip has been added. It was expected that more would have been done. The drains further up Mill Hill have water standing in them. A survey of the drains had taken place a couple of years ago. This will be followed up.

- **3. Planning:** there were no plans to discuss
- **4. Grass Cutting Tender:** there had been some confusion about the tender duration, as the contractor who tends the grass cutting of the recreation areas was on a two year contract, therefore an assumption had been made that the contractor cutting the verges was also on a two year contract. He was not aware of this. It was determined to instruct the contractor to cut the verges within the 30 mph signs, four cuts a year, with the final cut, cutting the whole width of the verge, plus flailing the playground hedges, manually trimming the entrance to the Church End play area, and spraying the weeds in the Reading Room car park twice. It was agreed to accept his tender if closely





similar to 2019 and instruct the contractor, on the basis that for 2021 tenders would be invited on a three-year term.

- **5. Village Sign:** the village sign needs refurbishing. It has been cleaned it in the past, but there was a concern that a non-specialist clean would strip all the paint off it. It was agreed to investigate whether any grants were available, asking CAPALC for assistance.
- **6.** Annual Parish Meeting: it was expected that the Ivy House development planning application would be discussed at the May meeting, and thus attract parishioners. It was determined not to invite outside speakers, but to launch the website.
- 7. Policies: the council's Safeguarding Policy and Equality Policy were adopted at the meeting.
- **8.** Three Free Trees: following a discussion it was determined to apply for the voucher for three free trees from SCDC, with a value of £60, but to buy one larger silver birch tree, to be planted by the pond, with a dedication for Alan Scott.
- 9. **Donation:** it was proposed that the parish council donates £100 to the Village Seniors Group, funded by the Briggs Gift this year, and that the money should be paid directly to the Reading Room to cover five months' rent.

It also depends on whether large applications have been submitted and accepted; the following year more smaller applications may be accepted. It was determined to resubmit the application as it is, with updated SID data.

Trees in The Causeway



Road Closures

Green Bin Collections Suspended

Green bin collections across South Cambridgeshire will not take place between Monday 23rd March and Monday 4th May. This will allow crews to concentrate on emptying blue and black bins during



the coming weeks, and will also assist with any future staff sickness or self-isolation issues.

For this period only, the advice to residents who do have food waste will be to put it into the black bin, and to consider home composting as much of their garden waste as possible.

If bins don't have much waste inside it would be a big help to the hardworking crews if residents can wait until the bin is full before putting it out, if they think they can manage until their next collection.

Double bag black bin waste if suffering symptoms:

if your household is experiencing the main symptoms - a new, continuous cough and/or a high temperature

– please be very careful when disposing of your personal waste, including used tissues and disposable cleaning cloths/wipes. It should be put in a plastic rubbish bag, tied when full, then be placed in a second bin bag and tied. It should be kept separate from other waste in suitable secure place on your property for 72 hours before being placed in the black bin as normal. The principle behind this method is that after 72 hours outside the body, the virus is no longer viable. This approach will help keep bin collection crews as safe as possible.
