Spring is often associated with a sense of renewal. In plants and animal life, maybe even in our outlook, emerging from what may feel like a long dark winter. This spring that feeling is intensified, looking for renewal after a difficult



looking for renewal after a difficult winter with the coronavirus pandemic. We are looking for green shoots of hope and recovery: through the vaccine programme; maybe schools returning and workplaces becoming safer; through longed for opportunities to meet with friends and family again, and greater human contact.

March is also a time when we journey through Lent, the traditional forty-day period when we reflect on our lives, perhaps give something up or take something





on, and prepare ourselves spiritually for Easter. There can be a penitential feel about Lent, yet many this year may feel the weary months of lockdown have been penitence enough! At the heart of Lent, however, is a journey from the ashes of sorrow to shouts of gladness, from slavery to freedom. A journey of gratitude which recognises the true hope we have in Jesus Christ through his death and resurrection, and through the gift of his Holy Spirit.

As part of the Lenten journey, more or less in the middle of it, we also celebrate Mothering Sunday. A British couple are 'inadvertently' drawn into an attempt to rescue a member of the Russian Mafia and his family as well as foiling a major money-laundering plot, with the help of British Intelligence.

Although some found it difficult to get into, once the action picked up, it turned into an enjoyable thriller with a perhaps unexpected and, for some, a somewhat disappointing ending. There are some humorous moments but parts are chillingly prescient of recent events. Scores were mainly 8 out of 10, with a 6 and a 7.

#### Marsh Tit Study

Spring is definitely coming now – and don't we need it!

You might see Seven Spot Ladybirds (*Coccinella septempunctata*), a native species with easily

remembered common and Latin names (coccin = red, -ella = lady suffix, septem = seven, punctata = spotted) have been congregating on sunny twigs and posts. It's probably an adaptation to the cold, but could be courtship behaviour.



Male Brimstone butterflies (the yellow ones; females are almost white) are being regularly seen now, whenever the sun is out.

The recent cold weather forced some unusual birds to garden feeders. A pair of Pied Wagtails and a Goldcrest all ventured to Joyce's feeders along Mill Hill. These species are insectivores, only turning to seeds when insects are hard to find. So now is a good time to look for a rare treat around your bird table . . .

You might have noticed that Long Tailed Tits are no longer travelling in flocks, but in pairs. Your Marsh Tits are easy to see, as they're hitting garden feeders

very hard at the moment. Each seems to have a different area to forage. Red over Blue over White 'Tatiana' and Black over White over Black 'Rasputin' are regulars at Joyce's feeders on Mill Hill. Red over Blue over Red 'Dora' paid a visit to John's, further west along Mill Hill.



We're very interested in these sightings, as some of these birds are very old. This is of national significance for conservation. For instance, Black over Red 'Moaty' seen by Len and Ben and possibly also by the Heald family is at least six years old, three times the usual wild lifespan. And it still seems to be pairing up for breeding this year! Do
