#### From the Vicarage

The Church of England has been facing bad publicity. All the clergy and ministers serving this group of churches have had conversations with people who feel angry or disappointed about recent decisions regarding who can become a Bishop. The Church appears to be fragmented, and out of step with society. On the Church of England website, Archbishop Sentamu has written an article about the Church. He quotes an African proverb, 'if the tiny toe is hurt the whole body bends low to tend it.' The Church of England is currently 'bending low' and we wait to see what healing will emerge.

The Lent Talks this year are an attempt to explore some contemporary issues. We are focusing on how the church can meet the 21st century. The first talk (at 7.30 pm on 27<sup>th</sup> February at Holy Trinity, Hildersham) is by Adrian Chatfield who is director of the Simeon Centre – for prayer and the Spiritual Life – which is housed at Ridley Hall in Cambridge. There are forms of praying that suit different personalities. Challenges can change the way we pray. This is an opportunity to explore ways to deepen the spiritual life during Lent. The second talk (7.30pm on 6<sup>th</sup> March at The Black Bull, Balsham) is by John Nicholson, who is a Mental Health Chaplain. He is going to talk about ways that we can be whole in body, mind and spirit. In a recent article he quotes this description of what spirituality is: "It is what is deepest in us - what gives us direction, motivation. It is what enables a person to survive bad times, to be strong, to overcome difficulties, to become the mselves." Spiritual Well-Being: Policy and Practice, Bradford 2001.

#### Poppy Appeal

Although the week before Poppy fortnight is really busy and hard work, what with opening parcels, unpacking stock, preparing poppy boxes and tins, and delivering poppies, badges, wrist bands, posters and wreathes, it has never failed to be rewarded. Whilst my husband, Tim, and I take a breather, all the willing collectors get cracking going door-to-door, and the shops and pubs put up their posters and collect generous donations from the visiting public.

Without all the money that is raised during Poppy fortnight, the life-changing help that the Royal British Legion is able to give to Service families, veterans and ex-Service men and women coming to terms with injuries that have changed their lives, would not be possible. So many people, with the Legion's assistance, are enabled to make a fresh start in spite of adversity. This only happens because of the likes of you all who collected, donated, advertised and counted. West Wratting raised the sum of £388.57 thanks to The Chestnut Tree and five collectors who went to the far ends of the village in some really horrid weather to collect your donations in exchange for a paper poppy. The static point at Weston Colville Post Office collected £51.49 which is also fantastic. We would not be celebrating an overall increase in the amount collected in our area (which includes West Wratting, West Wickham, Weston Colville, Balsham and the Gog Magog Faim Shop) without the help of forty collectors. The total was £2714.60 (with a small amount of gift aid to be added). Within this total there were sums of £295.00 for wreathes, £740.51 from static collection points and £1679.09 from house-tohouse collecting.



My role as Honorary Poppy Appeal Organiser is to thank you on behalf of the Royal British Legion for helping them continue their work. On a personal level, I just want to say that I couldn't do this, and wouldn't be able to find the energy to do this, without the amazing support that all you collectors and those who help with counting, as well as my husband, so generously give to me - my grateful thanks.

#### Weston Colville Parish Council

The January meeting covered the following:

**County and District** – District Cllr Richard Barrett reported that Council Tax is likely to stay at the same level.

The Horseshoe Lane garages will be looked at shortly to see which are in use, with a view to exploring the site as a potential one for affordable housing.

County Cllr John Batchelor reported that a meeting on January 29<sup>th</sup> will make decisions about what will happen with the No 19 bus service, currently being run as a mini-bus service by CCC.

Some complaints had been received about the state of the road at Church End below the church due to debris left by recent flooding. Cleaning of the road by CCC will be investigated. Cllr Richard Cobbald reported that he will be creating a new ditch to assist drainage on the road.



The officer has been notified of all Weston Colville's flooding 'hotspots' and will come and see them.

Flooding issues on Common Road have been assisted by locals who have cleaned the culverts (thanks go to Andrew and Gordon). The new footbridge at Horseshoe Lane has also helped; the level of the bridge has been raised, reducing debris build-up and assisting water flow.

**Rights of Way** – the crumbling base of the footbridge leading on to the footpath that goes up the track past Lakeside had been replaced and the bridge resurfaced. The permissive footpath/bridle way from Horseshoe Lane to the Conifers has been cut and is passable by riders.

Dog fouling continues on the footpath next to the chapel on Chapel Road. The council will provide a new bin at the entrance to the path.

Village Pond – the pond had not been cleaned by the contractor within the 6 week time limit and it will be October before cleaning is possible again. Silt and rotting branches are building up. SCDC officers had reported Crassula in the pond but Cllr Allen Scott had been unable to find any. He will investigate further when the weather is warmer.

Flooding and stream maintenance – the County Council has taken over some flooding responsibilities from the Environment Agency, and a new role of Flood Risk Management Officer has been created.

small amount of additional funding that we gained enabled us to employ an extra maths teacher so that we could reduce the large GCSE maths class sizes, but that was pretty much all. At the same time we were trying to manage a £70K hidden 'cut' to the funding all Cambridgeshire schools received for building maintenance and ICT facilities. We had a brand new building and no money to equip it with. Fortunately the kindness and generosity of our local community of businesses and parents meant that we managed. Second-hand furniture and computers were donated, companies gave money for books and the LVC Friends raised funding to equip the student common rooms with new furniture by organising a sponsored walk, quiz and Burns night. The work of the Friends has been brilliant in the past couple of years. We couldn't have managed without them!

However, the hidden cuts continue in education: the new funding formula for Special Educational Needs will leave us short of what we had in 2012, and South Cambridgeshire District Council is proposing to withdraw funding for its Arts Development Managers and the Village Colleges will be expected to pick up the full salary costs.
