From the Vicarage

Twenty-four people came to a meeting on 13th August to explore the prospect of having a Parish Nurse. At the meeting it was noted that there are people who are struggling in our villages and whose needs are not met by statutory service providers. Good neighbours and priests and lay people from the churches work to try to help, but find that needs are increasing. There are communications links that are missing to support the work of caring agencies in the community. There is sometimes a need for an advocate to work with individuals when they need to access help. It is not just the elderly but across all ages. Young and old people who are ill or incapacitated can experience isolation. Mental health issues can affect all ages, sometimes made worse by economic stress. The GPs at the meeting talked about the potential benefit of having someone who could form a strategic link between the community and healthcare providers.

work with vulnerable people of all ages, including young families and those with mental health problems, often as the first point of contact, and then referring on to other schemes and health professionals.

At the end of the meeting it was agreed to develop this further by setting up a group to work out a more detailed job description and costings, and to look at how to raise the funds needed. It was also understood that the role of the Parish Nurse should be structured so that it meets new needs and does not replicate the valuable work of the Warden Scheme in West Wickham, West Wratting, Balsham and elsewhere or, for example, the Forget-Me-Not Scheme in the Abingtons and Hildersham...

Weston Colville Parish Council

The Parish Council meeting on 13th August covered the following items:

Stream maintenance – the possible replacement of the bridge beside the ford at Horseshoe Lane has been discussed with the county bridge engineer. Some silt clearance is thought necessary and the landowner will be contacted.

Village pond – the village pond has been inspected by the SCDC Ecology Officer and some traces of *Crassula* remain. AS has made a visit to the pond but was only able to find one plant. The clearing of silt from the centre is proposed for September, which it is hoped will raise the water level. The proposal was voted on and carried.

Street lighting - Weston Colville has SCDC lamp standards so is not currently subject to the changes taking place in the county. There is to be a consultation after which Weston Colville may have the same rules applied.

District Councillor's report – Weston Colville is not affected by the new SCDC Local Plan which limits development to within the existing village envelope. There will be an exhibition of the local plan at Linton Village College on 15th September.

Emergency planning – after a talk by Lawrence Green of SCDC describing the production of a local emergency plan, it was agreed that Bridget Durham would undertake a risk assessment and produce a plan for Weston Colville. It will be sent to Mr Green once it has been agreed by the council at the November meeting.

Planning Applications – the following applications have been approved:

S/1174/12/LB Mr R Henderson Single storey side extension and internal alterations, Green Cottage, 58 The Green

S/0861/12/LB Mr & Mrs R Mills Single storey rear extension, external and internal alterations, Three Horseshoes Farm, Horseshoe Lane.

ROSPA report – there were no problems reported at the Weston Green Recreation Ground play area. The slide in Church End needs some anchorage and this will be done shortly.



Financial matters – the current balance is £5368. Credits were received from the village event fund and a contribution from R Southall to the cost of the plaque. Cheques totalling £706 were approved and signed.

From The Meadow School Governors

The Meadow Governors aim to promote continued school improvement by supporting and challenging the school, providing strategic direction and engaging with children, staff and parents openly and honestly.

The Meadow School is very much a community school, and as well as the regular updates on general school activities that appear in the village newsletters, the governors would like to outline some of the priorities with which the governing body has been involved over the past year.

One of our main areas of activity is assisting senior staff in monitoring the school's Raising Attainment Plan (RAP), a document that identifies priority areas within the school for particular attention. Governors this year have assisted with assessing data on achievements in maths, improving the system for management of Teaching Assistants, and assessing the impact of a new Behaviour Policy.

Another major role of governors is to assist with setting and managing the school budget. This has become increasingly challenging in the past two years amidst the tighter funding provided to schools, especially a much smaller Capital Fund (for the fabric of the school and its ICT equipment). A programme of essential repairs to the school roof scheduled to take place over the next five years, together with replacing and updating the school's computer equipment, will use a high proportion of the Capital Fund over the next few years. We are extremely grateful to the Parent Teacher's Association (PTA), which has assisted with some ICT purchases, and we have established a Working Group involving parents, staff and governors to explore other ways to support the renewal of the school's ICT equipment.

Governors also have a role in strategic planning and have been involved this year in the unavoidable decision to reduce the number of classes in the school from ten to nine in September. Historically, the school expanded in the mid-1990s following new housing in the catchment area, but families have stayed as their children have grown up and the number of primary-aged children has dropped again.

The school is due for a full OFSTED inspection, and governors have been helping the senior staff to fully understand the new inspection framework that came into force in January, and to ensure all the documentation that OFSTED may require is up-todate.

Linton and District Historical Society

Due to circumstances beyond our control, the first meeting and AGM of the Linton and District Historical Society will be held at 7.30 pm on Tuesday 16th October in Linton Village Hall, and not on Tuesday 18th September as expected. All are very welcome.

September 2012, however, is a very important month in the history of the local villages that have the glacial esker ridge run along the north side of the Granta Valley. It represents the centenary of the start of the pre-Great War – War Games between the Red and Blue armies that were fought on these ridges, a wide range of dignitaries came to watch, including the King and the Kaiser, and the results of the exercise changed the way warfare was conducted forever.

The 5th Field Troop of the Royal Engineers arrived at Linton on Wednesday 28th August 1912 to prepare camps for the Cavalry Brigades.

The local paper, dated 6th September 1912, described 'During the past few days a large Canvas Town has sprung up on the outskirts of Linton. The 16th Lancers, 18th Hussars, 4th Dragoon Guards, a Veterinary Hospital, 2 batteries of the Royal Horse Artillery, 5th Field Troop of Royal Engineers, and the Signal Troop of the Army Service Corps, all took up their quarters in the camp'. These huge tented cities sprang up in the fields in many villages. Lawson, so big players from the actual Great War. The Red forces were supposed to push south as quickly as possible.

The Blue anny was commanded by Sir James Grierson, with the Cavalry under Colonel Charles Briggs, the 3rd Infantry Division under Major-General Henry Rawlinson and the 4th Infantry Division under Major-General Snow. Sir James Grierson ordered a general mobilisation with the prime goal of stopping Red forces entering London. Time was of the essence for both sides.

The mock conflict took place between 16th to 18th September; to find out more you will need to come to our opening meeting on 16th October, and read the story here as it unfolded over the months leading up to Christmas 2012.

Heating Oil and Gas – Getting the Right Measure

At the time of writing we're having a mini heatwave, so you might not thank me for tunning your thoughts to the winter months! But sometimes time flies far more quickly than we like, and in our British climate who knows how early a cold snap will arrive. Some of you may therefore be considering buying in your fuel for those cold months.

In Cambridgeshire, Trading Standards work closely with heating oil and bulk gas suppliers to help them ensure their tankers are measuring and dispensing fuel accurately. This helps to ensure that you, the customer, can be sure you're getting what you've paid for. When it comes to bottled gas, local Trading Standards services check the meters at the bottling plants to ensure they are accurate. We provide support for businesses to make it easier for them to meet regulations and provide good customer service too.

The scenario was that the forces of an imaginary country (Red) had crossed the frontier dividing Red from Britain (Blue) between Wells-next-the-Sea and Hunstanton. The Red army was commanded by Lt General Sir Douglas Haig, with Major-General Edmund Allenby in charge of the cavalry divisions, the 1st Infantry Division with Major-General Lomax, and 2nd Infantry Division with Major-General However, for added peace of mind there are a few checks you can make yourself, at the time of delivery, to ensure you are getting the fuel you paid for.

Heating oil and bulk gas

On most tankers there is an automatic ticket printer that records and prints the quantity of fuel dispensed into your tank. You should be given a copy of this delivery ticket. If you want to make absolutely sure it is correct, you can take the following steps:

- for heating oil, observe the fuel being dispensed from start to finish (for safety reasons we do not advise this for bulk gas);
- inspect the ticket before it is put in the printer and before the fuel is dispensed to make sure it is yours and that it remains in place until it is printed again on completion;
- when the ticket is inserted, make sure the meter shows 'zero';
- at the end of the delivery, check the reading on the meter is the same as on your ticket.

A small number of oil tankers still use a dipstick to measure fuel being dispensed. This is harder for you to check as your own dipstick or sight tube may not be as accurate.

Bottled gas

Bottled gas is sold by the weight of its contents which should be clearly marked on the cylinder. If you want to be sure that you have received the correct amount of gas, you can take the following steps:

- check the amount marked on the cylinders adds up to the amount on the delivery note, and both match the amount ordered;
- where fitted, check the plastic seals are in place and that the essential safety information is stamped or painted on the side.
