From the Vicarage

At a social occasion, someone's friend told me that she played the organ. Like so many of us, the organist was shy about her gift and not best pleased at being drawn into the limelight. A few weeks later, when all the known organists were busy and there was an uncovered service, I asked her to play and she agreed. Without her we would have had no organist and no hymns. She used her gifts well and we all benefitted.

Recently, members of the six PCCs across the seven churches met together. They shared ideas and experiences. Since the meeting I notice that they have already started to adapt each other's ideas to different contexts. There are some things that we do better together than when we act on our own.

As we draw near to Christmas, we tend to think about things to give to others. However, people often underestimate the gift of their time. Vulnerable people sometimes say to me that they do not want to be a burden, without realising just how good it is to spend time with them, or how good they are at encouraging those who are able to be more active.

As I write this, there is a group of people who are working to apply for grants and draw up a job description to employ a Parish Nurse. There are other people who are working together to draw up specifications to put running water and toilets into some of the churches. Rosemary, Sharon and Kathy have been encouraging work with children and families, and there were 35 children from across the parishes at a recent service where children acted in a drama. Keith Day has begun his training to become an authorised Lay Minister in music. Steve Jordan has taught us some different songs. Richard commissioned the choir to sing a beautiful piece of music that he wrote. There is a lot of talent and energy being used in these creative ways. Hard work

is being tackled, and more is possible when people work together.

In the seven-church meeting someone suggested that perhaps we should all secretly nominate people for roles. It is the case that some of us do not recognise our own talents and need others to invite us to share them. Sometimes we only discover we are good at something when we have a go. Everyone benefits when gifts are shared.

There are Carol Services at 10.45 am at West Wratting and 6 pm at Weston Colville on 23rd December, and crib services at 4 pm at West Wratting and 4.30 pm at Weston Colville on Christmas Eve. The Midnight Mass will take place at 11.30 pm at West Wratting and the Christmas Day Family Communion will take place at 10.45 am at Weston Colville. Please join in.

I hope you have a peaceful Christmas.



West Wratting Book Club

We met on 13th November to review Oscar Wilde's 'The Picture of Dorian Gray'. Set in the 1890s, it traces the life and times of Dorian, from when he has his picture painted in such a way that his subsequent misdemeanours are reflected in the portrait, leaving him with the face of eternal youth. He essentially just wanted to experience a huge range of amoral situations, enabled to do so by vast wealth and encouraged by Lord Henry.

Our reviewers felt that the style and content were 'all over the place', so as a consequence it was hard to 'get into', and one reviewer gave up reading it. But, that said, the overall comments ranged from "intriguing, hedonistic and narcissistic", to "thought provoking" and "carrying the mes for today". As a classic, it has to be read, and scored 7.8 out of 10. We would all recommend it but it would depend on the person!

Interestingly, the poetry discussion took much longer, and provided a welcome mixture of modern and traditional Christmas poems, and also poems on being thankful at Thanksgiving. I had not seen 'The Father Christmas Letters' by J R R Tolkien, which were magical, with the 1929 one being written to tell the

First Round of Grants from the Wadlow Wind Farm Community Fund



At the first meeting of the Wadlow Wind Farm Community Fund panel, held in late September, over a dozen applications were considered for funding. Requests came from a wide range

of projects, requesting in total over £60,000 of support. Three grants were awarded to our parishes. St Andrew's, the Parish Church of West Wratting was offered £2250 to refurbish the church organ, subject to raising the rest of the money needed. Weston Colville Cricket Club was offered £3000 to contribute towards purchasing a free standing modular changing room, subject to raising the rest of the money needed. The RAF Wratting Common Memorial was awarded £948 to repaint the inscription on the Memorial. The Trustees of RAF Wratting Common Memorial Trust Fund, Weston Colville Parish Council, is very grateful for this grant. The work will be carried out in the summer of 2013.

New applications for funding are invited over the coming months for consideration at the next panel meeting, which will take place in early March 2013. Weston Colville Emergency Planning

South Cambridgeshire District Council has passed to us the request from the government that all communities should have a plan in place, to be activated in time of emergency. Examples of when it might come into use are if we are cut off by heavy snow, or if the power is out for a lengthy time. Please think if there is any way you could contribute to our overall plan by offering skills, such as first aid, or equipment, 4-wheel drive vehicles, camping stoves, sleeping bags, etc, that might help us assist and support the overall response of the emergency services. If you are happy for your name and offer to be included in our plan, please phone me, Bridget Durham on 290082, or contact any member of the Parish Council.

In addition, with the winter months fast approaching, be prepared. Where possible, keep spare batteries for a torch and radio, have some long-life food in the cupboard that can be simply prepared, maybe without electricity, and look in on your neighbours, particularly if they are elderly or live alone.



West Wratting Parish Council News

Below is information on some of the items discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on Monday 12th November.

Peter & Ruth Lloyd Trust: no student this year has applied for a grant from this Trust. If you know of someone who is continuing their education and would like some financial assistance please contact the Trust.

Maintenance:

- a) Further maintenance work has been carried out at the Village Hall, replacing the back door and panels, which were rotten, with a new door with higher security. A request was made to the Parish Council for a contribution towards the cost of this, and this was agreed.
- b) Cllr Wallace is taking advice from the Tree Officer at SCDC about the condition of the ash trees.

Danger Spots:

- a) A further meeting had been held with the Chairman of West Wickham, the Safety Officer from SCDC, and Cllrs Job and Ross-Bain, to look at options to slow traffic down at the crossroads on the Common. Rumble strips seemed to be the least costly of the options and could be shared between the three parishes, but no decision has been made.
- b) Two requests for footpaths had been received, one on Honey Hill from Viking Close to the junction, and the other from The Common to the junction at The Chestnut Tree. There was concern for the safety of children and adults, with the roads becoming busier, and driving faster. The Parish Council will look into the various options, which will be discussed at the next meeting.

c) Dist Cllr Hickford told the Parish Council that there was to be a meeting, on 27th November at 7.30 pm in Linton Village Hall, for parish councils to discuss further the safety aspects of the A1307. On 10th December there will be another meeting, to be attended by the local MP and County and District Councillors, to discuss ideas from the former meeting.

Bus Review: current services are being maintained and the Transport Department is looking at the various options. It is hoped that a Saturday service might be resumed, but money is short.

Signage to War Memorial on Common: due again to the lack of money at the Transport Department of Cambridge County Council, this will unfortunately not be carried out. However it is hoped that the Parish Council may be able to provide some signage.

Housing Survey: Mark Deas, from Acre, who put out the Housing Survey to West Wratting parishioners, will be attending the next meeting with the results of the survey. He was pleased with the response from the parish.

Gritting Volunteers: Cambridge County Council have again requested the help of volunteers to keep the roads in their village gritted, and thanked them for the help given last year. If someone out there is happy to help please let me or someone from the Parish Council know. Training, if necessary, is available.

The next meeting will be on Monday 14th January at 8 pm. All welcome.

The draft minutes are posted on both noticeboards.

Weston Colville Parish Council

The Parish Council meeting of 29th October covered the following items:

Afford able/Social housing: following a presentation by Mark Deas of ACRE, it was decided that a survey should be made in Weston Colville to see if there was a need for affordable housing in the village.

Stream maintenance: the replacement of the bridge at the end of Horshoee Lane will be completed soon. The question of stream clearance is still ongoing. The Council has contacted the owners and farm contractor concerned and further investigations will be made.

Village Pond: the work by Borehams to clear the middle of the pond will begin soon. It is now the best time as wildlife is mostly dormant and the least disruption will be caused.

Street Lighting: there is to be no change to the management of street lighting in the village.

Emergency planning: Bridget Durham has undertaken a risk assessment and will produce a plan for Weston Colville. She will be asking for volunteers to add to the SCDC database.

Planning App lications: the proposal for change of use of The Lothbury Centre from shop/art gallery to residential was supported.

Speed limits: a £5000 grant with a 10% contribution from the parish has been confirmed to change the speed limits in the village. The current 40 mph limits will become 30 mph limits, and the current unrestricted limit will be 40 mph limit. For further details see the noticeboard, where there is a map showing the changes.

Bus Survey Meetings: Allen Scott has attended both the recent meetings of Cambridgeshire Future Transport held at Balsham. The new bus time tables will be based on Linton as a hub. They will probably stay in place until April next, when further changes may take place.

Wind Farm Meeting: the village had been successful in its application for Wind Farm grants for the Weston Colville Cricket Club changing room project (£3000) and for the re-lettering of the RAF Wratting Common War Memorial (£948).

Change of Parish Clerk: the Chairman thanked Christine King on behalf of the council for her hard work during her time as Parish Clerk, and introduced Jill Smyth who will take up the post from 16th November. Christine will continue to assist in the production of a Parish Plan.

Date of next Parish Council meeting: 14th January.

Other awards were presented by Jonny Bairstow, Charlotte Edwards, Mike Gatting, Richard Kettleborough (international umpire), the Minister for Sport (whose name I have already forgotten) and Andrew Strauss, who I got to meet later for an autograph.

I did not win the national award, as there were many more deserving candidates, but it really was a wonderful day out, and I feel privileged to have been given the opportunity to represent the county and Weston Colville at such a prestigious event.

Linton and District Historical Society

The Linton and District Historical Society talk for December will be a celebration of 'Christmases Past' and will have a wide range of contributions. It will be held at 7.30 pm on Tuesday 18th December in Linton Village Hall. We will be having a Christmas raffle and festive refreshments. All are very welcome.

The Society is very pleased to announce that its secretary has made a successful bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund under their 'All Our Stories' scheme, which was linked to the BBC's 'Great British Story' television series with Michael Wood in the summer. The project that will be undertaken is entitled 'Hildersham --a Century of Change Between 1800 - 1900, a Village Transformed'.

Hildersham was the last parish in Cambridgeshire, and one of the last in the country, to have its fields enclosed in 1896. This meant that, after the way in which tithes were collected was changed in 1837 under the Tithes Commutation Act, a small 'domesday book' style survey was carried out of all the land and property in the village, which identified who lived in what houses at this time.

With the help of Hildersham's children we intend to look back at who lived in their homes in the past, and for them to help create an archive of then and now.

On behalf of the Linton and District Historical Society we greatly thank the Heritage Lottery Fund and we look forward to working on this project and sharing the results with you all in a wide variety of ways.




