From the Vicarage

In April the Bishop of Ely presented all the churches in the Diocese with a consultative document in which he invited us all to 'Imagine the Future'. It came from his observations after visiting churches during his first year in post. He has asked us all to seek ways to be Self-supporting, Contributing, and Investing. This has given us much to think about. How can the churches here in these six parishes make sure that we are sustainable into the future? For each church there are questions about how we can make our ancient historic buildings open, accessible and functional, not just for our own needs but for the communities we serve. In some cases this begins with repairing what is already there, sorting out drainpipes, putting in suitable heating, getting rid of damp and making sure that the organ can be played. For others, this is raising questions about whether running water, toilets, and a simple server can be put into the building to enable us to offer hospitality and activities that will serve our communities better and ensure the future of the church.

We must not forget that living amongst us are people in real need. Two recent incidents have reminded us not to be complacent. The burial took place of Sally, a woman who lived, unknown to most of us, in a tent on the edge of the village at Abington. We also had a talk from Ann Merrigan, the manager of the Foodbank at Haverhill, who told us that she took food boxes to people in these villages. Over past months we have already been thinking about how the churches might better care for local vulnerable people. In each village there are local people willing to visit, and we are now also trying to plan for and employ a Parish Nurse. We continue to support the work of Janet, our Age UK Village Warden. 'Celebrating Age' will be part of the service taking place on 14th October at 10.45 at St Andrews, West Wrating – this is in anticipation of an

Age UK event taking place on 16th October in the Village Hall at West Wrating, starting at 1 pm.

It is not just the adults that have something to contribute! I recently went to one of the Children's Church Councils at Hildersham. I will talk more about this on another occasion. I just wanted to say now how impressive it was to hear the ideas and energy for making things happen that the children mustered.

The churches are also being invited to think about how we can be good stewards of our financial resources. In the current climate we are all finding it hard to pay for what we have.

On 6th October all six Parochial Church Councils are meeting together at Weston Colville to share ideas, good practice, and ways of working together to support each other. If you have ideas that you want us to consider please let me know.

Please also come along to Keith Johnson's Study Day on 'The Lord's Prayer', taking place at Balsham Church Institute on 27th October from 10 am to 3 pm. Keith has spent the last six months studying this, and has come up with some very interesting ideas. Lifts will be available.

Thank you to everyone who sponsored my 7 church bike ride for Historic Churches and Weston Colville Heating. I have already received £200 of what is nearly £300. If you agreed to sponsor this, please let me or Gill Parry Brown (3 Church Lane, Balsham) have your contribution.

45 minutes, without notes, on John Clare, the most famous rural poet of his generation. Dr Blythe is 90 in November!

After a excellent tea, donated and served by the Friends under difficult conditions, seventy four people attended a traditional 1662 Evensong with Withers' poems feelingly read by the twins.



End of Season Report



The curtain came down on this season's league matches with a sound victory by 47 runs for the 1st XI at home to Fordham on 15th September. Batting first, Weston amassed a challenging total of 217 all out (Adam Curtis 44, Ade Westley 70) and proceeded to bowl the visitors out for 170, with some attacking bowling from Matt Daniels (3 for 29) doing most of the damage. Weston finished in a respectable 6th place in Division 2 of the Tucker League with 260 points, just one point behind Abington. NCI and Waresley are promoted to Division 1, and the bottom two clubs, Granta II and Babraham, slip back into the CCA Senior League.

Earlier in September the 1st team suffered a couple of defeats, by 49 runs away to top club NCI on 1st September, and at home to Granta II by 3 wkts on 8th September. Good performances against NCI were from Joe Robins (29) and Matt Daniels (4 for 38), and against Granta, Ade Westley (45 and 3 for 47), Joe Robins (27) and Sam Scott (2 for 26).

Overall, a sound, if not exciting, performance from the 1st XI in a rain and injury affected season, and they can look forward to 2013 with confidence. Congratulations to Ade Westley, 1st team Captain, for steering the side well in a difficult year, and thanks to Steve Potter who wrestled with the difficult task of getting the team together for 22 Saturdays over the summer; to Anne Bragg, 1st team official scorer, with her multi-coloured pens, to Trevor Westley, Bert Westley and Martin Taylor for all their work on the

ground (not forgetting stints on the heavy roller), and to everyone who provided the delicious teas in the intervals (for both the 1st and 2nd teams).

The 2nd XI narrowly lost their final game at home to NCI V on 1st September. Fielding seven junior players, Weston did well to restrict NCI to just 102. In reply, Weston started well, with Will Brown making 40, but a mid-order collapse could not be stemmed by a late fight back from Duncan Gray and they fell just short on 97. The second team have had a disappointing season, with some senior players unavailable for various reasons throughout the summer, but it has given a lot of our younger members the opportunity to take part in senior cricket. The 2nd XI finished next to bottom of Division 5C of the CCA Junior League (Burrough Green were bottom), with Bottisham-Lode and Newmarket II promoted to Division 4.

The transition from junior to senior cricket is an important bridge to cross and the club, through its second team, provides that critical pathway which leads onward to success at senior level in the future. We are optimistic that the second team will be stronger next year with the availability of more players combining youth and experience. Thanks to Colin Eade and Andrew Tooke who together ran the second team this season and encouraged and supported the younger players in moving up to senior cricket.

On Sunday 16th September, the annual Vice-President's Match was played between two 8-man sides made up from the 1st XI and Martin Taylor's invited players. As the numbers were short, the innings were restricted to 20 overs each, but some decent scores were achieved, and the weather contributed to a very pleasant afternoon, helped greatly by the delicious teas, and the BBQ after the game.

The Cricket Club AGM will be held on Monday 1st October at 7.30 pm in the Reading Room. We should be very pleased to see any new players or anyone interested to hear more about the club and its activities.

Treading the Boards

As part of our new Adult Community Learning programme at Linton Village College we are introducing a new course starting on 9th October, entitled 'Treading the Boards – Making Theatre'. The course will run for 10 weeks including half term, until 11th December, at a cost of £85.

The course is for everyone and you need not have any experience of theatre to attend. The course will explore various aspects of theatre through practical means, and learners will explore how text can be developed into physical theatre; how ensemble casts can inspire exciting staging ideas; how soundscapes can enhance dialogue; and how real voices can develop verbatim theatre. These techniques will be put into practice as students experiment, devise and rehearse their own theatre performance under the guidance of Rachel Yates.

Rachel Yates trained in theatre in Liverpool before moving to London where she gained her degree in Performing Arts. Rachel went on to become Head of Dance Programming at the Islington Arts Factory, Head of Dance at Barnet College and then became a lecturer at Middlesex University, teaching contemporary dance technique. She joined Chickenshed, the world renowned pioneering theatre company, in 1998 as Associate Director where she currently teaches, choreographs, performs and directs main-house performances. Amongst the many productions Rachel has devised and directed the re, 'Mother of a Brown Boy' was shortlisted for Total Theatre's Award for best original work by an ensemble, and Amnesty International's Freedom of Expression Award in 2007. 'On the Surface' for the International theatre project 'Contacting the World'

took her to Bangladesh, and more recently Rachel received 5 star reviews at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival for her leading role in 'Slender Threads'.

Outside theatre work, Rachel has choreographed music videos for Temper Trap, Massive Attack and Adam Buxton's Bugs in collaboration with award winning director Dougal Wilson. The Temper Trap video 'Love Lost' won the D&AD Yellow Pencil Award for best music video of 2010.

Rachel is currently preparing to travel out to Romania where she will be once again working with Dougal Wilson, as his choreographer for the new Ikea advert.

Rachel's strong belief that everyone can access the performing arts makes her sessions lively, creative and vibrant, and often focuses on the strength of the ensemble. Her creative style of blending the physical with the narrative makes strong, bold theatre full of imagery and depth.
