From West Wrating Vicarage

*When that Aprill with his shoures soote
The droghte of March hath perced to the roote,
..... Thanne longen folk to goon on pilgrimage*

Or, for those of you not familiar with Medieval English,

*When April with his showers sweet with fruit
The drought of March has pierced unto the root
..... Then do folk long to go on pilgrimage*

– the opening lines of Chaucer's 'The Canterbury Tales'.

Well. I went on a pilgrimage of my own, not in April but in May, though the weather was as wet and windy as April, and not as sweet. I went with my sister and her husband to visit the grave of the uncle we never knew. Uncle Wilfrid, the second of my mother's two elder brothers, was hardly ever mentioned at home. He had been killed in Northern France in September 1918, when my mother was only ten and he was twenty. She barely remembered him, so he was little more than a name. But my sister was keen that we should visit his grave, and with the wonders of the internet it was easy to discover its exact location. So off we went to the little town of Hazebroek, about forty minutes south of the Dunkirk ferry port and not far from the Belgian border.

The cemetery of La Creule (or La Kreule in the Flemish version which was prevalent until quite recently) lies just outside Hazebroek, at a junction on the bypass. Heavy lorries thundered past as we arrived in the driving rain and wind, carrying two roses, one white and one red, as he had been in the York and Lancaster Regiment, with a card that recorded the love and admiration of the niece and nephew he never knew. It is a small cemetery, only (!) five hundred graves, including about twelve German ones, and impeccably maintained like all the

War Grave Commission sites. It was unbearably moving standing there by this grave identical to all the others, yet totally unlike the others because my uncle was buried there. We were almost certainly the first members of our family to have visited it, and probably the first people ever to have visited this specific grave deliberately, as it were. You could not but weep – and I did.

Remembrance Sunday for me, as for any Church of England priest, has always been an important day in the year's ministry. But now it will never be quite the same. My perspective has altered. And this, it seems to me, is a good illustration of Edmund Burke's famous remarks about what he called the Little Platoons. "To love", he said, "the little platoon we belong to in society, is the first principle (the germ as it were) of public affections. It is the first link in the series by which we proceed toward a love to our country and to mankind." So one, in the greater sweep of history, extremely minor death has brought to me a greater understanding, and a greater intensity of feeling to the national scene.

And I couldn't help reflecting on the significance of visiting the grave. The final paragraph of George Eliot's towering novel, 'Middlemarch', says "that things are not so ill with you and me as they might have been is half owing to the number who lived faithfully a hidden life, and rest in unvisited tombs." Well, Uncle Wilfrid's tomb has been visited and in some obscure way I feel a debt has, at least in part, been repaid.

Skipper's Lane Junction

I wrote a few lines last year about this junction, and I
thought it may be helpful to share them so the
momentum to make changes continues and to thank
those that have made the proposed work possible.

It is spring again. After a bitterly cold and dark winter
the road verges have a splutter of daffodils. The

flowers that really intrigue me are concentrated
around a white concrete post, at a remote rural
crossing, less than a mile from home. Our drive leads
straight to it. I go past that crossing every day,
usually with the children in the car, sometimes we
cycle. My ten year old daughter and I stop by the
crossing. The speed limit is 60 but it is early on
Sunday and there is no traffic.

A local patient had told me the road had been closed
for a few hours. I imagined ambulances, police,
incident vehicles, perhaps a helicopter, diversions.
Glass, twisted metal, oil, blood ...

All that is left is a subtle disruption of the grass verge
and nine fresh cellophane-wrapped bunches of
flowers with tributes. Despite being in an open public
road I feel I am invading an intimate private space
when reading through them. I am trying to find out if
I know the deceased, as the junction is on the edge of
my practice boundary. Surprisingly it takes a while to
find the name. Several of the most intimate relatives
have not included it in their message. I don't
recognise it. From the description of the cards it must
be a young man.

Almost unbelievably the scene repeats itself barely a
month later. Another young life crushed and a family

Produce Show Schedule

Section 1: FLOWERS AND POT PLANTS

1. One specimen rose
2. Three stems any hardy flowering annual (mixed or same)
3. Three stems any hardy flowering perennial (mixed or same)
4. Five stems any pansies or violas (mixed or same)
5. Five stems any sweet peas (mixed or same)
6. A flowering pot plant

7. A pot plant grown for its foliage
8. Cactus or succulent plant (can be one or more and can be different varieties)

SECTION NOTES:

- All cut flowers should be displayed in water.
- All pot plants should be placed on a saucer or pot holder.
- Please name varieties if possible; this helps with the judging

Section 2: FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

9. Plate of ten raspberries
10. Plate of any other fruit (six of the same)
11. Salad bowl (selection of three salad items, mixed or same).
12. Three carrots, tops on
13. Five pods of runner beans, inc short section of stalk
14. Five pods of French beans, inc short section of stalk

15. Three courgettes (flowers on, if possible)
16. Five pods of peas, inc short section of stalk.
17. Selection of any other three vegetables (one of each)
18. Selection of any other three vegetables (three of the same)
19. Three onions, tops on
20. Four potatoes, same variety
21. Funniest or most misshapen vegetable

SECTION NOTES:

- White paper plates should be used for all exhibits.
- Class entries should be of one variety only, unless stated otherwise. Please name varieties if possible; this helps with the judging
- All vegetables exhibited must be clean and free from soil. Root vegetables should have been washed, but not scrubbed.

PRODUCE ENTRY FORM

- Please use a separate entry form for each exhibitor. Make sure that you adhere to schedule rules to avoid disqualification.

At a Village College it is sometimes difficult to draw the line between what is the business of the school and what is a community matter, because school and community are so inter-related. This is particularly true now that people have access to each other during all waking hours via the internet. It is easy for people to assume that what a child does in the street is the responsibility of the school, rather than a matter for their parents, and equally easy for people to think that what children write about each other on social network sites in their homes is something that schools should sort out. The lines can become blurred. Let me explain.

One of the drawbacks of the internet is that it gives people something to hide behind; they will write things in emails or on a social network site that they would not say to your face. If a child or a member of the public is offensive to an employee of a school (in an out-of-school context like on Facebook or in the street) BECAUSE they are an employee of the school then this is indeed the business of the school to address. The offensive remarks could be defamation

of character or be libellous if published in this way
and could damage careers or reputations.

If a child is offensive to another child on the internet this could be part of a pattern of bullying. Although the behaviour has occurred out of school, our own bullying policy makes it clear that we would investigate the matter if it is brought to our attention because, firstly, the bully's parents should be told about what is occurring and secondly, because we would need to be absolutely sure that no such unpleasantness was also occurring at school. Where we would draw the line is that we would leave parents to decide how to deal with disciplining their own children for any unacceptable behaviour that originated on their own computer.
