From West Wrating Vicarage

Although I now lead a very quiet semi-retired life here in the highlands of Cambridgeshire, occasionally I stiffen the sinews and summon up the blood and make a trip to London. Once a year I go to the Carlton Club, where I get a free dinner for saying grace at a fairly smart literary dinner. I have been doing this for nearly twenty years. The second year I did it I arrived at the club but as I went in felt that it wasn't as I remembered it. But someone, seeing my clerical collar, said "Ah there you are. We are upstairs this year" and I duly followed him. I was given a drink and tried to make conversation with people but somehow it didn't seem quite right. Eventually I asked a club servant the name of the club. "Brookes's, Sir?" he said, with a rising inflection. "Should be at the Carlton", I said shamefacedly. "Next door, Sir". A friend of mine said afterwards that it would have served me right if it had been Pratt's.

It did occur to me that I could possibly get a free dinner most evenings by turning up at West End clubs, "I am here to say the Grace" and would be duly ushered in. I suspect however that wouldn't work at the Groucho Club. This is a club in Soho which was deliberately set up for people who work in the arts and entertainment who wanted to escape from the stuffy world of gentlemen's West End clubs, and so has a slightly more raffish and Bohemian air. I expect you can wear suede shoes, even at dinner. As I say, I doubt whether grace before meals is a club tradition. It is called the Groucho Club after Groucho Marx, one of the Marx brothers' comedy team, who famously sent a telegram to his club saying that he wished to resign as "I do not want to belong to a club which would have me as a member".


"I don't want to belong to a club which would have me as a member." That would be a good motto for the Christian church in general, and the seven churches of this Benefice in particular.

Occasionally people say to me that they don't come to church because they don't feel good enough. I always

tell them that they obviously have never known well anyone who did go to church, as they wouldn't hold that delusion for very long. Being good is fortunately not a qualification for membership, otherwise our numbers would be even more depleted, not least in terms of clergy. Feeling that you are in fact not a paragon of virtue is actually the major qualification.

As many of you will know, major changes are taking place in the Diocese of Ely. Huge challenges face the Diocese: fewer full-time clergy, ageing and dwindling congregations, and a population explosion in the many new housing estates being built across the Diocese. The Diocese is in the process of developing a Strategy to help us all to meet this challenge. We are now in a process of consultation, which will finish at the end of March. The group tasked with developing the strategy has come up with what they call 'Five Levers for Change'. The first is called 'Nurturing a Confident People of God'. Now, a problem with the Five Levers as I see it is that the language used is very churchy, and for many of us it is quite difficult to relate to. So how about retitling it 'Helping Congregation to Feel Confident'? Because my guess is that not many in our congregations do feel terribly confident about their faith or the life of their local church. Well, there are all sorts of things we can do to help us to be more confident, but one way I want to suggest is to make a virtue of our weakness. All seven churches have small congregations and they are not going to be large, because our villages are small. So instead of bemoaning that fact, perhaps one task for us all is to consider the ways in which small congregations can have an advantage over large. To take up General Tom Thumb's theme in Barnum: bigger isn't better. Let's work out why bigger isn't necessarily better in the life of a church.

And let's celebrate those reasons and, who knows? We might feel we are a club worth joining, even though it's a funny old club that would have you or me as members.

It is interesting to read the rather different memories that Lady Ursula has of the village in the early 1950s from my own recollections.

For example, I wonder if any other readers of *Challenge* remember the 'old lady' who ran the Post Office opposite The Chestnut Tree? I knew it as Clarke's Stores but can't remember who ran the shop or when it closed.

I lived in West Wrattling from the time I was born in Dec 1937 until I moved away in 1959. My father was Bill Cutter, who was the blacksmith, and he told us of Lady Ursula calling at the blacksmith's shop to ask him to make various items for her Orangery. I also remember her making a very striking appearance at the annual midnight service at Christmas on several occasions, and of the church choir singing carols at The Park, when we were invited inside to entertain the house guests.

Weston Colville Neighbourhood Watch (NHW)

A date for everybody – 22nd January.

We have arranged for Rachel Carr to provide us with a talk and question time session on the 22nd January at 7.30 pm in the Reading Room. She is the Crime Reduction Officer for South Cambs and works with the police.

The past year has seen a much higher level of criminal activity in our village than I ever expected. This talk is aimed at answering our questions and suggesting ways that we can help to improve our own security, to protect ourselves and our property. She is aware of the problems that we have had. Probably the most useful answers will come from your questions, which you can raise on the night or better still send to me to be passed on to her in advance.

Local problems: fortunately our NHW has not heard of any problems recently but there have been several in the villages near us: damage to a car, and a mini digger and a taxi; stripping copper pipes from a house; cash stolen from a business, and a large quantity of power tools stolen from a van; and an iPhone stolen, when it was being charged on the sill, by forcing the window.

S/1748/14/LB – 7 High St – SCDC refused.

S/1998/14/FL – 3 High St – SCDC approved.

S/2268/14/PC – Camgrain applying for removal of restrictions on lorry movements. This was discussed at some length and it was agreed by the Council to turn down the application because of the following points:

- Safety aspect – if the application does go through, the road junction should be improved.
- Environment problems with regard to noise, pollution and poor roads.
- Request consultation to be carried out by the police authorities.

Finance:

- Request for purchase of a grass mower from Footpath team. This was agreed with a budget of up to £600.
- It was agreed to increase the amount donated to the cost of producing Challenge to £75.00.
- External audit had been completed satisfactorily.

Maintenance:

- Bowls shed needs demolishing as it is dangerous.
- The possibility of a Pocket Park path is still being looked into.

- Village Hall storage shed needs to be demolished and replaced with further storage units.
- Village Hall roof has been leaking and needs total renewal at a possible cost of £20,000. A survey is being carried out to be sent to the Parish Council. This takes priority.

Report of meetings attended by Councillors:

Sports Pavilion

- The money taken from the Sinking Fund has been paid back into the fund.
- Solar panels have been requested to go on the pavilion.
- The Football Association has stipulated that a defibrillator should be available on the football ground and they would like to put one in the pavilion. The Parish Council was in favour of the equipment but thought it should be by the village hall to avoid vandalism.
- The Parish Clerk asked whether the 'snags' mentioned in the survey carried out on the Sports Pavilion had been dealt with. This will be checked.

Traffic & general issues re speeding:

- Leanne Fisher gave a surgery in the village hall and she urged that speed watches are carried out on a regular basis, in conjunction with the other villages if possible.
- Cllr Nichols quoted a cost of £600 for five rondels, one at each entrance to the village.

Report by Dist Cllr Fraser:

- Services for building are being shared between SCDC and Huntingdon and now the legal and possibly IT services will be shared between SCDC, Huntingdon and Bedford.
- Green bins will be collected monthly from December to February.

- Extra ticket machines are being installed at the Park & Ride.

Report by County Cllr Hickford:

- The A1307 draft survey has been distributed and this showed that there is equal volume of traffic going both ways at peak time.
- Skippers Lane is ongoing.
- The budget discussions continue, with likely cutbacks to libraries, and gritting reduced to 30%.

The draft minutes will be posted on the noticeboards, and the next meeting will be on Monday 12th January. A very happy New Year to all readers.
