Flooding at Weston Colville


Did you suffer damage during the recent floods?

Interregnum

Seven years ago, I wrote a letter in Chassenge explaining what happens when a Parish Priest leaves. Canon Woolley had left the Balsham Rectory and the four parishes he had been serving were left in an interregnum or vacancy. Until the Revd Dr Julie Norris was appointed to succeed him we had a period of waiting.

Seven years later it is all happening again! Julie has been encouraged by both of our Diocesan bishops to take an eighteen month sabbatical to write a book which our national church needs urgently. Julie's doctorate was on the topic of the ethics linked to advances in medical research, and she is being asked to go to the next stage and write a book on the same subject. New medical procedures are being announced on a regular basis, and there is a need for careful study about their use. Will they be used in a way that is acceptable? There will be a whole range of similar questions that need much thought and careful answers.

Meanwhile we are beginning a new interregnum, and our churchwardens will be composing a profile of our seven churches group, outlining the needs which the new Priest-in-charge will have to fulfil. They will do this with the guidance of the Archdeacon of Cambridge, and then the search will begin for Julie's replacement. The ministry team which has been led by Julie includes the Revd Kathy Bishop, Mr Steven Wheeler, Mrs Rosemary Mead, Mr Keith Day, and myself, with the assistance of the Revd Dr Carrie Pemberton Ford and the Revd John Pinder. We also have the invaluable ministry of our Parish Nurse, Mrs Teresa Letimier, who joined our team in January.

Julie's legacy includes spearheading the project to appoint a Parish Nurse, and the adoption of the policyof Ely Diocese to make every parish church open and equipped for the use of the surrounding community. Under Julie's leadership three of our seven churches, Hildersham, West Wickham, and (to be completed in October) Great Abington have already been converted for use in this way, with toilets and kitchen facilities. The plans for Balsham include constructing a Parish Room at the west end with toilets, and the funding for this is also almost complete. Weston Colville church has had a new nave floor, opening the church up for community use, and a new heating system for the chancel. In April

West Wratting suffered a theft of lead from its roof and the PCC are doing everything they can to complete repairs before the winter weather.

As I wrote seven years ago, what we can all do is to support with our prayers all those involved in taking our services in the coming vacancy. It is vitally important that the right person is called to serve as our new Priest-in-charge, and so your prayers matter probably far more than you can ever realise.

What Next for St Andrew's Church Roof?

St Andrew's PCC wants to update everyone with what is happening about the church roof, following the theft of a large portion of lead in April.


A group of brilliant volunteers has put a temporary roof on, but we need to make this cover good and complete before the winter weather hits (although whilst writing this in the summer heat that time feels a long way off!). Behind the scenes, at the beginning of August Sebastian and the clergy team secured consents from South Cambs and the Diocese to replace the missing lead, and also the remaining lead, with steel. This was the result of a lot of hard work from the West Wratting team and our thanks go to them for that.

This means we can now move to get prices and then schedule work for the repair and renewal of the roof, and then eventually redecoration of the church to deal with the spring water damage.

Some funds have been allocated over the years for fabric repairs, and some events are already planned to raise more funds, as we think the total costs are be likely to be in the region of £80,000, plus the redecoration. We can cover about half of this at present through current church funds, so we think we need to raise about another £40,000. We need to get this money confirmed or in the bank before we hire the contractors, and as we hope we would be able to get

the work done before our traditionally bad weather starting in January this is clearly a tight timeframe.

We have to raise this money ourselves, as the Diocese does not have provision. If we don't keep the church in good condition there is a very real risk the building will be closed.



So, what next? Well, we have a plan of action, part of which is to apply for grants (some done, some to do), and part of which is to capitalise on existing fundraisers such as the June Balsham Singers concert, the August clay shoot (on Saturday 27th August), the October concert (on Saturday 8th October), and any other events people can organise or suggest to raise funds. We are also appealing to local landowners, businesses and people in the village to help in any way they possibly can.

If everyone could think about how to help, and then do it, that would be great, such as raising more money from coffee mornings, darts matches/sponsored runs/cycles/dancing – really anything, please. Together we will make a HUGE difference.

The church building is there for everyone to enjoy, and it is not simply a religious building; it is there for anyone to sit in, meet in, drop in and make a cup of coffee/drink of squash, and to use for anything, such as exhibitions, which we have seen in the past, of village history and war memories, through to pantomimes, concerts, displays on bell ringing, and anything else.

It is possibly the oldest building in the village, and needs our help to stay open and alive for generations to come. Alone, feeling of no worth or value, the person said to me "I'm a burden to society, I wish I would die" and then sat and wept. It is heartbreaking holding a hand, listening, having some time together. She looked at me, I took her hand, placed a small wooden cross in it, and she smiled. I struggle to come to terms with such happenings in today's world and yet it is real.

For those nearing the end of life my involvement has varied; supporting them to live life to the full to the very end, encouraging them to do meaningful activities, to make memories for those they leave behind, as well as alleviating worries about their death and dying.

One contact was to support the carer and to respect the wishes of a cherished love one so that they could die at home in a dignified and peaceful manner. I was able to offer daily respite, a listening ear and a quiet presence. Then I coordinated and working collaboratively with professionals to ensure comfort, dignity and a peaceful end.

A lot of my work is supporting carers, with little or no respite offered to them from other professionals. As a devoted loving carer it is a huge responsibility and extremely tiring, caring twenty four hours each day, seven days a week. So many are so inspiring with

their devotion to care for another, but I'm also saddened as they themselves and their needs are often forgotten. There are many times when they need to attend appointments as an advocate, support or translator of medical terminology, so needed when facing possible life changing news, diagnoses, treatments and medications. This much forgotten problem deserves attention.

In contrast, I attended the preschool to talk with children about nursing. They asked their questions and listened and then they enthusiastically bandaged teddy and themselves.

These are a few of my encounters, but each of my days is so different, full and unpredictable. Each visit so unique, working compassionately to honour the worth of each individual, to address their needs as a whole person.

I know many of you too are caring with compassion, quietly behind closed doors; for this I am so thankful. I cannot stress enough how vast this work is and I don't say this for myself but for all to understand the real needs out there in the community.

My work continues with passion and enthusiasm, working together in sustaining our compassionate community. A compassionate community is one where people are not isolated, not forgotten, but a good place to be born, to live, to grow old and to be able to die with dignity. And where there is a helping hand to be found. This will only work with the support and commitment to be there for another. God's guidance, support and unconditional love for us prevails, it is pivotal and paramount as this project comes into fruition. I would value anyone's contributions or thoughts and thank you for those who have given valuable feedback in regards to this.





Marsh Tit Update

Firstly, a sobering national graph. This is why Marsh Tits are Red-Listed in the UK, yet Marsh Tits seem to be doing well around Weston Colville.



It might be your woods. There has been a general Marsh Tit decline in woodland across the UK, except deciduous woods. You can find more information at http://app.bto.org/birdtrends/species.jsp?s=marti&year=2015.

Our BTO licensed colour-ringing project is proceeding apace, to find the answers if we can. We're averaging one newly colour-ringed bird per week. Resightings are critical for us. We can't be there all the time, so the more pairs of eyes, the better for the Marsh Tits.

I'm pleased to say that we've had our first resighting of a colour-ringed bird in mid-July – the cheeky youngster S320010, 'Blue over Red (on left leg)'. The lower Red ring shows that he/she was ringed in Great Coven's Wood, and was found in Lower Wood, sneaking around the offered peanuts and fat balls in the territory of an adult pair, who are not his parents! He likes to live life on the edge, does Blue over Red.

It's gone quiet at the moment, as the adults of many bird species are moulting off the feathers worn out by the hectic breeding season, and the youngsters are losing their baby feathers. This means they're not able to fly perfectly – and they look UGLY – so they hide in the bushes and vegetation until their plumage has fully regrown. However, July produced two other young birds, S320047 'Blue over Green (left leg)' and

S320053 'Yellow over Green (left leg)'. The lower Green ring shows they were ringed in Lower Wood.

This is very good news, as it proves that Marsh Tits have bred around Weston Colville this year. We expect to find more juveniles in Great Coven's and Lower Wood.

Intriguingly, we have several Marsh Tits which have only been seen once, like the adult female D779544 (not colour-ringed), who appeared in a Mill Hill garden on 30th April and has not been seen since. They might have been caught by a predator, or died of old age, but that's unlikely to have happened to all of them at the same time.

This makes us suspect that there is another 'reservoir' of Marsh Tits around Weston Colville. Being a mostly woodland species, it's likely to be another wood. So we're keen to have a look in Hill Croft Wood, but I don't know who to ask for permission (I'm from Hertfordshire, so essentially a foreigner in these parts). If the landowner is willing, I'd appreciate a chat!
