

# West Wratting Book Club

Once again we were able to meet outside at The Chestnut Tree on a pleasantly warm evening to discuss Robert Louis Stevenson's 'The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll & Mr Hyde'.

It was written as one of a popular genre of supernatural stories for the Victorian Christmas market. The idea of a 'Jekyll and Hyde' personality has become part of our public psyche but the format and underlying themes of the actual short tale on which so many dramatisations have been based came as a surprise to some of us.

As would be expected of this author, it was agreed that it was extremely well written and, although not entirely accurate, it evokes the classic Victorian London of our imagination.

Told from the point of view of Jekyll's lawyer and through him, a mutual doctor friend and, finally, Jekyll himself, the main theme is of a successful, well-respected doctor with a darker side. What this consists of is only hinted at and leaves the reader to draw their own conclusions (a theatre production of the story was taken off at the time of the Whitechapel murders). It touches on the inner identities and duality within us all. Jekyll fears the discovery of this other side and the ruin and disgrace that would follow, so seeks the ultimate distancing of himself from this other side of him. This fits into a background of contemporary interest in consciousness, 'moral insanity' and criminal responsibility, and ideas of the 'criminal' type reflected in the descriptions of Hyde as a subhuman apelike being. Those who might wish to delve deeper into the themes of this and other stories related to them may wish to get the Penguin Classics edition.

# From the Rectory

I wonder how you felt in response to the news that the final 'unlocking', previously proposed for June 21st, was to be delayed? Perhaps you see it as a cautious but prudent step; or



maybe a deeply frustrating one. For many businesses around the country, including some within our parishes, it will be tremendously challenging. For those looking forward to larger gatherings including weddings, it may bring real disappointment.

Indeed, it's been part of our way of life during the pandemic that we've sometimes had to take each day and week as it comes, without being able to plan too far in advance. For some there has been a gift in living day by day, but it may bring with it a sense of insecurity, which may lead us to lose heart at times.

Church life has also been a mix of simply taking it week by week as well as trying to plan in advance! In looking ahead, we have recently created a new pattern of worship which we hope will be sustainable and enriching both in this time of crisis and beyond. Within our group of churches on a Sunday we now regularly have, covid rules permitting, 9 am services, one 10.30am service, and usually a 6 pm Evening Prayer. There will also still be a service available online at 10.30am.

Recently, our lay minister in training, Kristi Stewart Elliott, challenged us in a reflection to contemplate these words from our bible reading: "So we do not lose heart" (2 Corinthians 4:16). St Paul, who was writing to the church in Corinth, saw this as a vital part of Christian life and of seeing the world in the light of faith in Jesus Christ. Let us also seek to live today, in these still uncertain and turbulent times, as people who 'do not lose heart', who may both rejoice in the everyday and also look ahead with hope.

### Nature Notes

This is the time of year to see photogenic baby animals of all descriptions.

Young Marsh Tits will have left their nests now. They have the fearless boldness of youth. If you see them in your garden or in the woods, we'd love to know at cambsmarti@gmail.com or via Chassenge.

Here is a young Blue Tit, about a week from fledging, taken by Chris Smart during a licensed nestbox survey in June. This chick has a surly expression any human parent would recognise, as it's always hungry because it's growing like mad. Hatching to fledging takes just 15 days in Blue Tits (if only teenagers did the same . . .).



That huge yellow gape encourages Blue Tit parents to push food in from dawn to dusk -16 hours a day at these latitudes. Rapid growth minimises a chick's time in the nest, when they are most vulnerable to predation.



Some youngsters are not so vulnerable, though. Last month, nocturnal screeching revealed these two fluffy Tawny Owl chicks to Steve Thompson at John O'Gaunt golf club in Beds.



Leaving the nest before fledging is called branching and it's common in this species. Don't let the fluffiness fool you into thinking they are defenceless: the powerful raptorial (grasping predatory) feet develop early in Owls and raptors.

I once had the privilege of meeting a fluffy Eagle Owl chick. Its big beak nibbled my finger in an almost ticklish manner. So I let it step onto my hand. It was rather like putting my fingers into a workbench vice with razor-sharp claws. Once bitten, twice shy!

# West Wratting Parish Meeting

This is a precis of the 2021 Parish Meeting Reports. The full reports can be found on the website and also on the noticeboard.

Chairman's Report: the chairman looked back at the past year and the impact it has had on everyone's lives. She has been so impressed at the way the village community have pulled together supporting those more vulnerable and in need of help with shopping, prescriptions etc. The council has carried out its meetings via Zoom until this May meeting when they met again in the hall.

The refurbished playground is a great success and thanks must go to all those who fundraised in order to add to the grant money successfully applied for.

The chairman thanked Cllrs Davey and Bonfield for their work implementing traffic calming measures; Cllr Lock for coordinating planning issues during the lockdown; Cllrs Roberts and Davey for providing valuable liaison with the Sports Pavilion Committee; and Cllr Bonfield who, with the chairman, works with the village hall committee.

**Parish Paths Partnership:** Cobby McCall reported that due to the lockdown more people used the



footpaths and in order to give clearer directions, he was able to obtain a quantity of way markers. He thanked his team for all their hard work clearing the footpath near the phone box and also clearing 15 years' worth of rubbish away from the entrance boundary of the recreation ground. He also thanked the Johnson family, Simon Anderson, Raymond Maskell and David Perrin for their important input.

West Wratting First Friday Bridge: Sheryl O'Donovan hopes to continue the sessions as before as soon as allowed, meeting on the first Friday of each month at 7.30 pm in the village hall.
