
#### Nature Notes

It's berry season – wild raspberries and blackberries are in the woods. Migrant birds like Blackcaps are filling up on these for the long journey south. This is the time of year when the new season's crop of Marsh Tits will begin to run out of food in the woods and start hitting your garden feeders. A celebrated migrant graced a garden in Weston Colville early in August – a juvenile Cuckoo, raised by a pair of Dunnocks. By now it will be south of the Sahara, nearing the Congo basin. (Live map of satellite-tagged Cuckoos at :https://www.bto.org/ourscience/projects/cuckoo-tracking-project). There was a similar juvenile in the same garden last year, probably also raised by Dunnocks.



To be accepted by a host species, you'd expect that the Cuckoo egg must look like the host's eggs. The egg chart from the Natural History Museum shows this to be true, except for the Dunnock! Cuckoo eggs on the top row, host eggs on the bottom row. (From left, Great Reed Warbler, Red-backed Shrike, Reed Warbler, Dunnock, Brambling, Garden Warbler, Meadow Pipit, Pied Wagtail. Dunnock eggs are a uniform bright blue, but the Cuckoo can get away with laying a larger, spotty egg. Unsurprisingly, the Dunnock is one of the main hosts for Cuckoos. It's an intriguing mystery why Dunnocks haven't evolved better egg discrimination.

It's also a good time for moths. I was lucky enough to be invited to Wicken Fen to participate in a moth

night, where the outstanding camouflage of my personal favourite the Buff Tip moth mimics a piece of Birch twig.





Wicken also produced an incredibly rare reedbed specialist, the Reed Leopard moth. In the UK, this species is known at Wicken Fen, Hickling Broad in Norfolk and nowhere else.

Lastly, it's not well known that our hedgerows are important in fighting climate change. Great Britain has half a million kilometres of hedgerows, making them our largest semi-natural

habitat. They are refuges for wild plants, and green corridors for wildlife to move through farmland monocultures, slow down soil erosion and pesticide/ fertiliser runoff into water supplies, and have even been shown to improve air quality by trapping air pollution. We have less than half of the hedgerows we had in 1945. The UK Climate Change Committee has recommended that 40% more hedgerows are planted and wants the Govt to commit to this for the upcoming global COP26 conference in Glasgow. Can we put back some hedgerows in our area?
