The soup kitchen held as a fundraiser for Ukraine in West Wratting village hall at the end of March raised £500 in donations for the cause. Many thanks to all involved.



A short open-air May Memorial Service will be held at 12 noon on **Sunday 29th May** at the RAF Wratting Common Memorial, to commemorate the 33rd anniversary of the unveiling of the memorial stone. The last Sunday in May was chosen as it was the same day in 1943 (Sunday 28th) that the airfield was commissioned. The memorial is dedicated to those who served at the airfield, especially the 260 who gave their lives in the cause of freedom. We look forward to seeing some of the veterans who served with XC Squadron, 1651 Heavy Conversion Unit and 195 Squadron. Cadets from 1451 (Haverhill) Squadron of the Air Training Corps will be on parade.



I'm someone who usually loves an excuse for a party or gathering! Like many, then, I've really missed these things at times over the pandemic. Yet it hasn't just been about missing celebrates.



We will soon be reminded again of this importance as we look ahead to a very special weekend in early June. The weekend of Sunday 5th June will see people around the country, and indeed the world, gather to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee which marks the 70th anniversary of the accession of the Queen, and to give thanks for her service and dedication as monarch. 

The Village Green Group

Eight of us met on April 18th for an exchange of ideas and tea and cakes. Several themes were evident but some of them require the whole village to be involved (that's you, Weston Colville).

The broad aims of the group are to share recycling, reusing and reducing tips and information, to decrease consumption of materials and care for the local environment (and by implication the wider environment too). Below are some of the points discussed.

PUBLICISE shops which provide refill facilities/ products. The outlets that we knew about were Arjuna Wholefoods, Mill Road, Cambridge; Daily Bread Co-operative, Kilmaine Close, Cambridge; Plumbs Dairy, Linton; Full Circle, Norfolk St, Cambridge; Radmore Farm Shop, Victoria Avenue, Cambridge; Nourish, Linton High St. All have websites.

SOCIAL MEDIA – '39 ways to save the planet' Podcast; 'Zerowaste Guide' on Instagram.

SHARING – car journeys to Cambridge in particular but other places as well. Green bin sharing seemed to be a thing. Composting was also discussed, as was resurrection of the seed/plant exchange. Sharing of recipes for seasonal gluts of vegetables and fruit, and even larger garden equipment, eg pressure washers.

Information about **RECYCLING** by arranging a visit to the Cambridge recycling centre on the A10.

Another idea that was well received was to organise a meeting at the Reading Room and invite **SUSTAINABLE ENERGY PROVIDERS** to give presentations, if there was enough interest. We will contact South Cambs DC about energy saving incentives.

LOCAL ENVIRONMENT – it was evident that a lot of us do collect litter when we are out and about in the parish but were unaware of other people doing the same. It was good to hear that there are other wombles in the village.

Fun Family Dog Show

As part of the Weston Colville Jubilee celebrations in June, there will be a Fun Family Dog Show with classes that should appeal to anyone with a dog. The classes are as follows and will start at 2.30 pm on the cricket field. Entries on the day, £1/class.

- 1. Waggiest Tail
- 2. **Fabulous Golden Oldie** (open to the older canine: over nine years old)
- 3. **Obedience** (puppies under one year old sit, lie down on command, and walk to heel on a loose lead)
- 4. **Best Paw Shaker** (dogs will shake hands with the judge)
- 5. **Best Junior Handler, under twelve years old** (walk to heel on a loose lead with a change of direction, sit, down, short stay on lead one step away from the dog and return without the dog moving)

Nature Notes

It's late spring already and the Cuckoos are coming back! Joyce Oliver heard one in Weston Colville on 19th April. This BTO map shows the position of twelve satellite-tracked British Cuckoos on 18th April.

As you can see, two birds (called 'Ellis' and Grove') had reached the UK, four were in western Europe, and the rest still in continental Africa. Cuckoos spend at most ten weeks in the UK and overwinter in the Republic and Democratic Republic of the Congo, so calling them British birds is



rather inaccurate – they're better described as tropical African birds which take a spring break in the UK to breed.

This summer visitor to the UK prefers sparsely populated upland areas, in western Britain in spring and summer and in Spain and Morocco in winter. I've heard of migrants on steep sheep pasture in the Pegsdon Hills, a rural Bedfordshire beauty spot climbing to 172m above sea level. But . . . a shy upland bird, in a village garden practically at sea level, in the flattest part of the UK, on April Fool's Day? I thought the photo was Photoshopped and I scoffed. Boy, was I wrong. It turns out that at least one of their migration routes from Spain to western highland Britain takes them right over Cambridgeshire. Large slice of humble pie, eaten with relish...

Your Marsh Tits are now breeding, so we're not birdringing in the woods for the next two months. However, we will be ringing in gardens and looking for colour-ringed Marsh Tits everywhere. Emma Kaye has made a wonderful discovery: we have a third Marsh Tit surviving to at least six years old. Red over Black over Red 'Christi' was spotted at the Moat House on 24th March. Christi was colour-ringed as an adult (minimum two years old) by Rachel Durham on September 2018 – her first colour-ringed bird. The longevity of Marsh Tits in this area is a welcome surprise and the Linnean Society has asked us to talk about them. (Darwin and Russel Wallace first presented their theories of evolution, as a joint paper, to the Linnean in 1858). If you see a colour-ringed Marsh Tit, photograph it if you can and send the details to me at cambsmarti@gmail.com or to Chassenge. Thanks!

Community Pharmacist Consultation Service

What is CPCS? When you call us, our receptionists will ask about your symptoms. If these indicate that you can be helped by a pharmacist, you will be offered a same-day private consultation with a community pharmacist.

Pharmacists are qualified healthcare professionals and experts in medicines. They can offer clinical advice and over-the-counter medicines for all sorts of minor illnesses, and a same-day consultation can be arranged quickly and at a time to suit you. This in turn frees up GP appointments for those people with more complex symptoms who really need to see a GP.

How does it work? We will forward your details to the pharmacist, along with details of your minor illness. The pharmacist will contact you to arrange your consultation on the same day, or at a time that suits you. You may be seen in person in a private consulting room if the pharmacist thinks it appropriate, or your consultation may be carried out over the phone or via video. You will be asked about your medical history and symptoms and current medication, in the same way the GP would ask you about them. Usually, the pharmacist will provide you with advice and can recommend an over-the-counter product if needed. Details of your consultation with them will be sent to us for our records.

If the pharmacist feels you need to be seen by a GP urgently, they will call us to ensure you are seen, or they will advise you to contact the hospital Emergency Department if deemed necessary. You may also be referred back to us to arrange a non-urgent appointment or follow-up.

Why is this a good thing for patients? Community pharmacies are local, can be open longer hours than us, and can offer you the same consultation outcome at a time that is convenient for you. If the pharmacist thinks you need to see a GP, they can help arrange an urgent appointment for you. Patients who have already used this service liked the convenience of having a consultation on the same day, or a day that suited them, at a pharmacy of their choice.

Permissive Path – Mill Hill to Lower Wood

Due to the unusual amount of rain during the winter 2020-21, and the ongoing operations to extract firewood and timber from Great Covens Wood, the permissive path from Mill Hill to Lower Wood in Weston Colville had become very wet and muddy.

After consultation with Cambridgeshire County Council, Brinkley Hall Farms granted temporary permission for walkers to use the field margin from Mill Hill to Lower Wood, until the permissive path was re-instated. The condition of the permissive path (the track) is now good, so could walkers please revert to using it and not the field edge.

The landowner could have closed the permissive path for the duration of the timber extraction operation, but decided to allow people to walk on the field margin, and would be grateful if this decision could be respected.
