

West Wratting Book Club

We discussed 'My Pen Is The Wing of a Bird: New Fiction by Afghan Women' and all agreed it was very good. These short stories are packed with fascinating snapshots of life in Afghanistan, and not what's in the news, the stories on the radio, in fact enemy forces are rarely mentioned. Instead, it's the everyday lives of buying lemons, boiling water and looking at family photos – humanity, just a different humanity. This is interlaced with the misery of being the property of a man and being one of two wives – joyless whether you are the first or the second one – and of the dread of a bomb. It's grippingly disturbing and brutal and the foreword by Lyse Doucet celebrates literature as 'resilience and release, a life lived inside your head'.



One comment was "I've recommended to several people, I absolutely loved it, it's not the truth but I'm sure it's not far from the truth". Another echoed "I like to see the reality of others' lives". One of us was surprised that religion was not seen by these women as among the problems they faced, indeed they seem to have a strong faith of their own volition and pray to their god to help them in life.

Among our favourite stories was Ajar's, sparks of hope from the message for all of us that we can achieve anything if we work together.

If there has to be a criticism, it was that some ended abruptly and with ambiguity. Scores were between 7 and 9, mostly at the top end. The feelings we have been left with are awe at the chain of communication the writers went through to get their work out, and that we all of us want the same things in life, we just speak different languages.

Our next read is Maggie O'Farrell's 'Marriage Portrait' and we'll be getting round the table at The Chestnut Tree to talk about that on Wednesday, 16th November at 7.30 pm. All welcome; enquiries to Linda Gorman (290653).

Then, on the last Sunday in November, we enter Advent season, four weeks of prayerful preparation for Christmas. In a world where waiting may be associated with frustration and Christmas seems to start earlier and earlier, Advent could seem out of touch! Yet learning how to pause and wait prayerfully actually helps us enjoy life more deeply, focus upon what really matters, and may be a wellspring of peace and gratitude before God. So much then, this month, which may give us pause for reflection and prayer, and so much to be grateful for.

Year 5 children have once again had the opportunity to participate in the fully funded Bikeability scheme




Year 8 and 9 boys had the opportunity to take part in a contemporary dance workshop led by Sam Willmore, commercial choreographer and dancer.
