Footpaths Update

It has been a difficult year for our footpaths. We had agricultural quantities of rain in March, April and early May, which has led, in my estimation, to the grass and cow parsley being about 30% higher than normal.

The County Council did its first cut in early/mid-May, after which, due to plenty of moisture in the soil, many of the paths are back to square one. The exceptions are the cross-field paths, which have been cut recently (thank you Ollie), the path backing West Wratting Park (thank you Luke and Alicia) and also the path through Scarlett's Wood.

The next cutting is scheduled to start in early August, and should be signed off by August Bank Holiday, but if anyone would like to get their strimmers out, say round the immediate village perimeter, this would be welcomed by all.

The brambles are late starters, but will start encroaching on the paths. It would be hugely helpful if, when walking round the area, we take a pair of secateurs and do some snipping during our walk.

Because the grass is so high, there is the added risk of ticks, especially if you are wearing shorts. Due to the


presence of deer, there is about a 10% chance of catching Lyme Disease (opinions vary on this). Make sure you remove the tick as soon as possible. Tick removers can be bought at Boots and other chemists. Ticks are ubiquitous and like the softer, damper parts of the human body (say no more!). I normally get around five ticks every summer when holidaving in Denmark. After removing them, I rub the area with a rough towel, and apply an antiseptic (I use TCP) for about 48 hours after removal. I often pick the small scab to get more antiseptic on, but if, after say 4 - 5 days, the red spot starts spreading and the outer edge is bluish (the Danes call Lyme Disease Borealis) have a talk with the medics. I am sure our resident doctors will have additional comments, but this procedure has (so far) worked for me.



From the Rectory

Summer can be a wonderful time for celebrations! At the time of writing, I'm looking forward to taking my children to the June Revels at the



Meadow Primary School, a really enjoyable occasion. We also have a number of weddings to look forward to in our group of churches over the summer. I feel wedding celebrations can have a ripple effect of joy into the community around them: a celebration of love, hope and faith which is both deeply personal and draws in a community of people who promise to uphold the couple in their lives together.

Then there are the numerous summer festivals. I'm a particular fan of the Christian festival Greenbelt held on the August bank holiday weekend, with its focus on arts, activism and faith. We've been going as a family for many years and in the words of Pádraig Ó Tuama, an Irish poet and theologian who regularly speaks at Greenbelt, it provides for many a 'sacrament of green'. It also creates, for those few days around that bank holiday weekend, a special community which debates, prays, and enjoys a party together!

Indeed, the Christian faith has long been rooted in this kind of community. Rowan Williams, the former Archbishop, said that when reading the gospels, you sometimes get the impression that if anywhere in ancient Galilee you heard a loud noise and a lot of laughter and talking and singing, you could be reasonably sure Jesus of Nazareth was nearby. His indiscriminate generosity and willingness to mix with people considered unsuitable by some parts of his society were vividly recollected by the gospel writers. Jesus sought out company, and the effect of his presence was to create a celebration, to bind people together.



Speaking of celebrating community, I'm delighted to announce that Hannah Threlfall, whom some of you may know as an ordinand (or minister-in-training) has recently taken on the role of Community Minister in our parishes for two days a week. This role will include pastoral care for people and supporting local initiatives which encourage community, compassion and faith. Helping Hedgehogs

Hedgehogs have suffered a drastic decline in recent years, but we have been having some success in restoring their population in our garden in Weston Colville, by putting out plates of food and water for them every night, and leaving plenty of suitable habitat for them. Monitoring with trail cameras shows that four or five hedgehogs currently come each night, and gives us fascinating glimpses of their social lives. But they are still vulnerable. They disappeared from here last summer, for unknown reasons, and the numbers have only gradually built up again this year, including two rescued ones that we released here from the Suffolk Hedgehog Hospital. We can all help to preserve them by taking simple precautions when managing our gardens: by making sure that anything put down to control rats is properly confined, and that any wood-pile destined for a bonfire is not concealing a hedgehog.

Nature Notes

We're back with a report of a new, male Marsh Tit bearing colour rings White over Blue over Red, better known as 'Felix the Adorable', after my other half's grandson. (No part of his name is optional, btw . . .) Second-year Marsh Tits like Felix the Adorable usually disappear by the autumn, and we really need to know where they go. Please watch out for Felix (the Adorable) along Mill Hill road, Church End, Lower Wood and Great Coven's Wood.

The BTO's satellite-tagged Cuckoos started returning to tropical Africa last month. Ours will be going too, but the juveniles stay until August. Look in your gardens for a heavily striped brown/grey bird about

the size of a Collared Dove with a shockingly red mouth, being fed by much smaller Dunnocks or Meadow Pipits. Here's one seen in a Chapel Road garden on 7th July 2020.

Dragonflies and damselflies (the Odonata) love the sun and heat. If you want to identify the odonatan you saw, head to https://british-



dragonflies.org.uk/odonata/species-and-identification/. A tip: if a large green and blue dragonfly, boldly chequered in black, comes up within 50 cm of you and takes a good look, it's probably a Southern Hawker.

Finally, a small quiz for you: what is this chick – one of seven – which came from this nest? The nest consists only of slivers of pine bark. I've only seen this species use a nestbox four times in twelve years. Answer is on page 12 of Chastenge.

A1307 Road Closure, 15th - 17th July

The Linton Greenway works from Hildersham to Dale Head Foods have been substantially completed, and the pathway and road are fully open.

Our original intention was to complete the planned carriageway surfacing by closing the A1307 between Haverhill and Fourwentways roundabout weekdays overnight, and diverting traffic on National Highways roads. However, we have now been advised that it is only possible to use this diversion at weekends.


