

## Parish Matters

I was reminded recently I have been a curate in the Granta Vale Churches for almost a year. Indeed, last week was the second anniversary of my ordination as a deacon and first



anniversary as a priest. A lot has changed in that time. Two house moves, lots of new names and new areas I have had to get to know pretty quickly!

Since moving I have enjoyed seeing the changing seasons of rural Cambridgeshire: snow in December; the vicarage garden come into bloom in spring; and now the vibrancy of summer, even though at times it has been a little bit too warm! Yet even in the midst of change, it's been helpful to be reminded that God's love and guidance remain the same.

Change is inevitable; sometimes it is exciting, sometimes it's daunting. When we follow Jesus, however, we need to be open for transformation and open to change our way of doing things. Jesus came to challenge the way it's always been. Much of his ministry brought about change. His disciples struggled to understand what all this change was about, and why it needed to happen. As they accompanied Jesus towards the cross, they gradually began to understand it. Their experience of the risen Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit further deepened their insight and courage. They were witnesses to an abundant life they hadn't known before. It needed change for that transformation to happen.

Faith in God can help us embrace change and be hopeful. For there is always hope and good news. God will always support us and sustain us. That is why we need to continue to respond to God's presence and keep him at the heart of our worship.

# Ely Cathedral

It is 1350 years since St Etheldreda founded two monasteries at Ely, and various events are being held in the Cathedral to celebrate this.

The shrine of St Etheldreda was much visited by pilgrims but all this ended with the dissolution of the monasteries. Etheldreda (Audrey) was born in Suffolk in the seventh century, a daughter of the king. She desired to commit her life to prayer and chastity, and after two arranged and unconsummated marriages, founded a religious house at Ely for both men and women. She died on 23<sup>rd</sup> June 678 and is remembered each year on this date.

## Nature Notes

Has anyone seen any Purple Emperor butterflies? I'd like to know if they've returned to our local woods since the tree felling and replanting. The males are big and purple and bold, females the same but brown.

Over the last month, Margaretha Galt has seen a male Common Redstart occasionally along Common Road, between Weston Colville cricket



field and the start of the open fields. Redstarts are handsome birds, as you can see.

There seem to be a large number of boldly black and white Great Spotted Woodpeckers around this year. Look for their exquisitely carved holes high up on tree trunks: about 8 cm across, perfectly circular with a neatly bevelled border, so the whole appears expertly countersunk for a screw head. You'll know you've got the right hole when you hear the loud, staccato

'pip pip pip' alarm call from the trees. Their eyesight is excellent, so they'll see you long before you see them. Adult males have a red neck, juveniles have a red crown and adult females have no red on the head at all. All have red vents.

If you see a Great Spot with a red crown, no red vent and very small (about the size of a Chaffinch), I want to hear about it! You might have a rare Lesser Spotted Woodpecker and the sighting needs to be reported to help its conservation. This species has declined even more than Marsh Tits, dropping 83% since 1970.

We really need to know how our Marsh Tits are doing after bird flu. As always, sightings please to *cambsmarti@gmail.com* or **Challenge**. Thank you to our regular spotters and a warm welcome to everyone else!

Enjoy the scream of the Swifts and the chatter of the Swallows before they leave for South Africa. The legendary Gilbert White believed Swallows hibernated in ponds rather than migrate, as they often flit around water to gather insects. In the early spring of 1770 and 1771, cold snaps made the Swallows disappear for two weeks. White thought they were much more likely to hide in nearby water, rather than migrate back to warmer climes for this short period. (*https://www.jstor.org/stable/106194?seq=1*). The perils of not testing your hypothesis!

The following matters were discussed at the parish council meeting on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July. The complete draft minutes are available on the noticeboards.

#### Planning: no new applications.


23/05596 – 1 Mill Road: The Asset of Community Value has been re-applied for and accepted, meaning we can activate the ACV for six months. During this time it would give the village the option to put an offer in for the purchase of the pub. It is hoped that Mr & Mrs Causton will inform the parish council about any potential purchasers. This would be helpful to reduce the risk of a potential purchaser who may have plans to develop the site rather than support our pub.

**Finance:** the list of authorised payments and 'monies received' is shown in full in the draft minutes.

Audit Update: the internal audit has been carried out satisfactorily and the report distributed. An external audit is not required.

**Councillor Vacancies:** the Vice Chairman said there were three vacancies to be filled but was pleased to report that three parishioners (Prof John Harvey, Simon Chandler, and Philip O'Donovan) present at this meeting had offered their services to be parish

councillors and were therefore proposed and seconded for acceptance. The documentation will be completed by them to be signed and witnessed at the next meeting.

#### Maintenance:

*Trees in Hayter Close*: Scilla Harvey spoke about the two trees planted by her husband and herself and registered under the Queen's Canopy Project. Although they had gone against the parish council's wishes they hoped they would now be allowed to remain and said she would take full responsibility for their maintenance. A vote was taken and it was agreed to allow the trees to stay in place.

*Village Hall:* update on Land Registration re Trustees – it is necessary to get the names changed on the Land Registration as they are no longer parish councillors. Information has been received from CAPALC about how to go about making this change.

*Recreation Ground & Pavilion:* Cllr Parsons reported that funding is being sought for the proposed junior football pitch on the old bowls green.

**Traffic Issues:** 20mph speed limit application – Cllr Chandler had heard nothing so far about the application but was told by County Cllr Batchelor that the matter was in hand and we would be notified shortly on the outcome.

Assets Register –the clerk had contacted the insurance company to add the items that were not registered. She was asked to seek quotes for an oddjob person to restore the benches, tidy the ivy around the bus shelter at Church End, and remove the fence at the back of the car park.

**Wildwood Festival Horseheath** – a complaint had been received, and West Wickham PC were holding a meeting to discuss next steps. No action would be taken by WCPC.

**Annual Return 2022/23** – documents were submitted to PKF Littlejohn on 28<sup>th</sup> June. Period of Public Inspection of accounts from 3<sup>rd</sup> July to 11<sup>th</sup> August. The Internal Audit Report was received; the suggestions will be implemented, and some of the policies reviewed in September.

## Granta Medical Practices Flu Clinics 2023

Flu vaccination is important because, whilst flu is unpleasant for most people, it can be dangerous and even life-threatening to others, particularly those with certain health conditions. The best time to have your flu vaccine is early autumn before flu starts spreading. However, you can get your vaccine later if necessary. Most flu vaccines are given with a needle in the arm but there is also a nasal spray flu vaccine.

Eligible patients will shortly receive a text with a link to book a flu jab, or you can call us on 0300 234 5555. Clinics will be available to book from August.
