'Tis the season of Nature's bounty. Pick those blackberries by the end of September, or they won't taste nice. If you see squirrels anywhere near hazelnut trees, don't even try to beat them to the ripe brown nuts!

Now is also the season to be surprised by spiders in the bath. Male Giant House Spiders (*Eratigena atrica*) are most obvious now, as

they're looking for females. Why they think they'll find them up dark, dank bath pipes is anyone's guess. Males are easily identified by a pair of large appendages hanging under the mouth which look like paddles or boxing gloves.

To keep spiders out, keep the plug in the bath and cover up the overflow hole.

The fabulous Jersey Tiger moth (*Euplagia quadripunctaria*) is flying till mid September. It is a large moth, ~approximately 5 cm long, active by day and night. Its forewings look exactly like the stylised zebra-stripe prints once fashionable as leggings or car seat covers. The hindwings – seen in flight or when startled – are vermilion, but sometimes orange.

This moth was restricted to

Devon and the Channel Islands until the 1990s, when its range started expanding (due to global boiling?) and now includes our region. In August, I saw this one in a roadside hedge in Hitchin, and several overnight at Wicken Fen, so they're certainly here. There's a prize for the first one spotted in our area!



The small but beautiful Ivy Bee (*Colletes hederae*) can be seen now till early November on Ivy flowers near southfacing, loose, light soil (for nesting). It looks like a Honey Bee but

half its size, with a black and white striped abdomen. There are many at the Mary Challis garden in Sawston.

Lastly, September is the perfect time to admire the long Dahlia border at Anglesey Abbey. Our favourite is 'Weston Spanish Dancer'. What's yours?


