The Weston Colville community lunches will restart in the Reading Room on Wednesday October 1st, 12.30 - 2 pm.



From the Parish – The Generous Heart

Many of us are facing difficult times at the moment, with the rising cost of living, and our general concern for the well-being of family and those close to us within our community. We all know what it is like to face challenging times, and we know how important it is to keep 'mind, body and spirit' together. When times are tough, we can find it helpful to exercise the body by getting out for a

brisk walk, some fresh air, a jog

perhaps. Well maybe not a jog, but any amount of movement can certainly help us manage our daily stresses, concerns and worries. Looking after the body can also mean enjoying good healthy food – and the odd bit of chocolate. With mental health concerns on the rise, I'm the first to admit that I spend far too much time distracted by social media; better to feed the mind with good things.

Mindfulness has become a term to describe our awareness of the present moment while calmly



accepting our feelings, thoughts and what may be going on around us. This is all very well, but in our secular world the workings of the mind have tended to take centre stage – as if all of our troubles can be solved in the room upstairs.

Cultures that value and practise the healing ways of prayer and meditation understand that prayerfulness is the journey from the head to the heart. 

Balsham Allotment News

The allotments were all inspected in April and a second inspection was completed in August. The Allotment Cup will be awarded for the most improved allotment, in the judgement of the Allotment Working Group.

The cup will be awarded at a 'bring and share' picnic at the Woodhall Lane allotments on Sunday 14th September, between 12 noon and 2 pm. Everyone is welcome. Bring your family and friends, chairs and picnic, together with any surplus produce to share. The Scout Hut will be booked to allow hot drinks/toilet facilities and a bad weather location, in case it is needed

There are a limited number of allotments available. The allotment year commences at the end of September so now is a good time to get a plot in shape for planting in the spring. A lot of time and effort is required to grow your own food successfully and there are inevitable disappointments – last year the slugs mostly won. However, it can be very rewarding, great exercise, you can grow what you will enjoy eating (and might be very expensive in the supermarket) and will reduce some of your food miles to virtually zero. 

Granta Medical Practices – Vaccines Update

FLU – this vaccine helps protect against flu, which can be a serious or life-threatening illness. It's offered on the NHS every year in autumn or early winter to people at higher risk of getting seriously ill from flu.

COVID-19 – helps protect against Covid-19, which can be a serious or life-threatening illness for some people. It's usually offered on the NHS in early winter to people who need extra protection from Covid-19.

RSV – helps protect against Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) that can make babies and older adults seriously ill. This is offered all year round.

SHINGLES – helps protect against shingles and is offered all year round. Shingles is a common condition that causes a painful rash. It can sometimes lead to serious problems such as long-lasting pain, hearing loss or blindness. You're more likely to get shingles, and it is more likely to cause serious problems, as you get older or if you have a severely weakened immune system.

PNEUMOCOCCAL (pneumonia) – this vaccine is offered all year round. It helps protect against serious illnesses like pneumonia and meningitis.

Book your flu vaccine with us and when you come in we can check what other vaccines you are eligible for.
