Strength and Balance

Martin Davey has been working with Forever Active to start a strength and balance class in West Wratting. The trainer they have identified is available on Friday mornings but not until end February/early March.

The description of the class as provided by Forever Active is as follows:

A Strength and Balance class using a resistance band is a low-impact exercise session designed to improve muscle strength, stability, posture, and coordination, while reducing the risk of falls and injury. It is commonly used for older adults, beginners or anyone seeking a safe and structured approach to whole body exercise.

This type of class also directly assists with daily activities by strengthening the muscles and balance skills needed for everyday movement. Improved leg strength and balance help with walking, climbing stairs, standing up from a chair, and getting in and out of bed. Upper body exercises make tasks such as carrying shopping bags, reaching overhead, opening doors, and maintaining good posture while sitting or standing easier and safer. By enhancing strength, coordination and stability, the class supports greater independence, confidence, and ease in performing daily living activities.

If you have fallen recently and needed attention, they might have to do a falls assessment before including you.

There will be an opportunity to try and see if the class suits you.

Parish Matters

February: Light, Dust, and the Journey Ahead

February often feels like a turning point. Winter still clings on, yet the days are unmistakably lengthening. Snowdrops push through the cold ground, if they haven't already. Lambing season begins, and there is a sense – however fragile – that spring is on its way.

In the Church, February holds that same sense of transition and invitation.

Early in the month we celebrate Candlemas, marking the presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple. It is a festival of light. Candles are lit to remind us that light has come into the world – quietly, vulnerably, and with hope. Candlemas asks us where we see light today: in kindness offered, in community strengthened, in perseverance through difficult times. Holding on to the fact and knowing that even the smallest flame can make a difference in dark places.

Later in the month comes Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It is a very different kind of moment – quieter, more reflective. Palm leaf ashes are used to mark the sign of the cross on foreheads, accompanied by words that remind us of our humanity and our need for God. It may sound stark, but it is deeply honest – with Lent, inviting us to pause, to reflect, and to ask what really matters within our lives.

Lent can often be misunderstood, seen as a season of gloomy self-denial. In fact, it is about making space – letting go of what distracts or drains us so that something new can grow. Some people give something up; others take something on: more rest

West Wratting Parish Council

The parish council met on Monday 12th January.

Public Forum & Footpaths – the Paths Officer reported that recent ploughing may have narrowed some local footpaths. This has been raised with the relevant farmer and will continue to be monitored.

Council Business & Finance – the council agreed to delay co-opting a new councillor, instead arranging an informal ‘meet and greet’ event ahead of the March meeting.

Budget planning for 2026/27 was discussed, with councillors approving:

- An earmarked reserve of £10,000 for Kingsway Solar Farm related matters (in addition to donations already received)
- A precept of £14,729, representing a 3% increase

The new lease for the d’Abo Tennis Club was approved and signed, and an update was received on a potential provision of an additional defibrillator in the phone box.

Planning – updates were received on current planning matters and tree works in the village. No new planning applications had been submitted since the previous meeting.

Kingsway Solar Farm – the chair reported that the Kingsway Solar Community Action legal steering group will be meeting with Pippa Heylings MP in mid-January.

Village Facilities & Events – the Sports Pavilion Management Committee reported progress on exploring a new structure for the club, including the possibility of forming a Community Interest Company (CIC).

Highways, Road Safety & Assets – the council agreed to end its contribution to the shared Mobile Vehicle Activated Sign (MVAS) scheme, noting that it is no longer required.

Paediatric defibrillator pads have been replaced as scheduled, and repairs are being planned to address peeling paint on the village pump shelter.

Next Meeting – the next meeting will be held on Monday 9th March at 7.30 pm; all are welcome.

Weston Colville Parish Council

Extracts from minutes for the Weston Colville parish council meeting on Monday 12th January; full minutes and meeting documents available at <https://www.westoncolville-pc.gov.uk>

Parishioners raised issues relating to the Kingsway Solar development and noted the recent ‘Targeted Consultation’ that would run from 7th January to 4th February. Concern was expressed about the use of minimal land for the project which was not reflected in the consultation document. Further concerns were about enhanced flooding, particularly in the area of the ford at the bottom of Horseshoe Lane, due to the particularly large size of the panels; about noise and vibration caused by such a large scale development; and about the construction of a haul road alongside the existing byway (Brook Lane) for access to the most eastern part of the development. These and other issues would be taken into consideration for the parish council’s response to the targeted consultation.

The salt/grit bin by the Reading Room has been sorted out and the contents are now accessible.

Cllr Batchelor was asked to look into two planning issues in the village relating to traffic movements and planning notifications.

Flooding – Cllr Garrod had met with District Cllr Harvey to inspect the stream behind the houses on Horseshoe Lane and the bank of the stream behind the new house being built at the bottom of Horseshoe Lane by the ford. Action was being taken by the District Council to address these two issues, both related to keeping the stream clear to allow water to flow freely.

Footpaths – it was questioned as to whether the temporary closure of footpath 16 at the bottom of

Horseshoe Lane for 6 months had been formally extended and, if so, for how long.

MVAS – Cllr Russell reported that although there were some indications that traffic was slowing down as a result of the speed indicator signs, some particular situations were a cause for concern. The devices indicate speed in both directions and some records showed vehicles leaving the village at up to 78 mph. It was suggested that recent records could be sent to the police to indicate the problem and to see if they might take further action to curtail speeding through the village.

Kingsway Solar – the Terms of Reference for the Kingsway Area Parish Council Alliance had been agreed by the PC at their last meeting.

The Targeted Consultation document was discussed. It was agreed that members of the parish council would submit contributions for the response to the targeted consultation as they had for the stage 2 statutory consultation held during September and October last year. The chairman would draft a combined response for submission by 4th February.

resurfacing the pavement along the green from No 1 to No 63; clearing all the drains on Mill Hill to include new drains where needed; and resurfacing the Common Road from the top of Chapel Road into West Wrattling just before The Chestnut Tree.

SCDC Local Plan– councillors will look at the consultation on the Grange Farm development proposal and send comments to the chairman, who would then co-ordinate a response.

Election 2026 – a note will be placed in *Challenge* about the upcoming elections in May.

Biodiversity – a free field maple tree had been received from the District Council and would be planted near the pond when the weather improved.

The District Council were now offering a commemorative blossom tree and plaque to honour community volunteers and remember those affected by the Covid 19 pandemic. The parish council was pleased to accept the offer.

Finance – it was agreed to increase the precept by 1% to £15,150, due to probable costs associated with the Kingsway development.

A decision on any financial contribution towards legal spending associated with the Kingsway development was deferred until the meeting in May. The council was not electorally competent at the moment due to the number of co-opted councillors. It was expected that this situation will change after the May elections.

Dates of meetings in 2026 – 2nd March, Wednesday 13th May, 6th July, 7th September, 2nd November.

Kingsway Solar Community Action

Just when we thought we could have a break, many of you will have received a leaflet from Kingsway Solar about a Targeted Consultation on six changes and one clarification to its solar farm proposal. This is not a full re-consultation and is not primarily about incorporating feedback from the statutory consultation. It runs from 7th January to 4th February 2026. Most of the changes result from larger battery storage and substations being required, after these were under-provided in the original design. This has forced changes to solar panel layouts across Areas A, B and C. While no extra land is proposed, the impacts on farmland, wildlife, public rights of way and open space are being shifted into new areas, not removed.

Please make your voices heard. If you haven't yet responded to the Targeted Consultation, you have until 4th February to contact Kingsway Solar by email at enquiries@kingswaysolar.co.uk or by post to FREEPOST DOWNING KINGSWAY (no stamp required). This update follows an important decision by the National Energy System Operator for Great Britain (NESO).

There is intense competition for grid capacity, with far more solar and battery projects proposed than the network can accommodate. In its December 2025 review of projects seeking 2030 connections, NESO confirmed that while Kingsway Solar has passed Gate 1, it has not secured a confirmed grid connection at Gate 2. As a result, access to the national grid is not guaranteed and battery storage now appears less likely.

Despite this uncertainty, Kingsway Solar has said it still intends to submit a Development Consent Order (DCO) application in spring 2026. Without a confirmed grid connection, this raises reasonable questions about whether continuing through the NSIP (Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project) process is a good use of resources, given that the potential local and environmental impacts remain unchanged.

We will be holding our AGM on Wednesday 11th February, 7 – 8 pm at the Reading Room in Weston Colville. Please come along to hear the latest updates on our community and legal campaigns. We have some committee vacancies, so do consider putting yourself forward if you would like to get involved.

We are also planning a further walk-and-talk in March, timed to coincide with the lead-up to the DCO application. We will again be asking for donations to the KSCA community fund. We have a new target of £55,000 by the end of March for the Parish Council Alliance legal fund, which will allow us to continue our work and ensure expert support is available to provide evidence for our concerns.
